The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. by Mr. Dennis Reaves, Chair.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Minutes of the CAC meetings from September 19, 2018, with one correction on page 2 changing Hwy. 78 to Hwy. 21, were approved on a motion by Mr. Miller Parnell and seconded by Mr. Buford Parker. Motion carried.

Chairman Reaves called for discussion of October 2018 Administrative Modifications. Ms. Libby Messick explained that there was a list of modifications in the agenda packet to review that were discussed and approved during the month of October to keep the members of the CAC up to date.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Chairman Reaves called for the Review of FY 16-19 TIP Update and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Libby Messick gave the members a copy of the current TIP and also a list of the ALDoT modifications for this month and briefly reviewed it with them. She stated that there were four modifications, but all of them were less than 20%, therefore no resolutions were required. Ms. Messick also explained that the total balance of funds did not include the 20% local match from the municipalities, so therefore it has been corrected and is now included in the total.

Next, Chairman Reaves called for discussion of Status Report of ALDoT projects. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of current construction projects in the agenda packet and briefly reviewed it with them.

Chairman Reaves continued by calling for discussion of Resolution No. 770 Amendment of Bylaws. Ms. Messick explained that the Bylaws had not been updated since 2003 and there were a lot of wording changes that needed to be made. A motion was made by Mr. Ed Kimbrough to approve the the Amendment with **Resolution No. 770**, which was seconded by Mr. Jamie Etheredge. Motion carried and this resolution will be presented at the next MPO meeting for consideration.

Next, Chairman Reaves called for the Review and Approval of Reclassification of Henry Road in Jacksonville. Ms. Messick explained that she had received the finalized map to include the new reclassification of Henry Rd. for all that wanted to review it.

Chairman Reaves continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that in the agenda packet was a table that she had created listing each observation discussed and it's response from the corresponding municipality for review. Ms. Joan McKinney asked about better lighting at the intersection of Henry Rd. and the new bypass. Another member also asked about the possibility of raising the speed limit on Bynum Blvd. Ms. Messick said that she would add the two new concerns to the table for the TAC and MPO to review. Mr. Chris Gann also told the members that the Storm Water Management Plan was on the Calhoun County website for anyone that wanted to review it.

### **OTHER BUSINESS:**

Chairman Reaves called for the report on Anniston Express and ADA Para-Transit Ridership. Ms. Messick stated that the last two pages in the agenda pack are graphs to review and explained that there was a total of 9,993 fixed-route riders for October. For the ADA Paratransit Ridership for October: Anniston had 928 one-way trips, Jacksonville had 216 one-way trips, 22 trips for Weaver, and Oxford had 141 one-way trips. For the Urbanized area 381 one-way trips and 200 one-way trips for the Rural area.

Next, Chairman Reaves called for the Update on Bicycle/Pedestrian Plan Update – stakeholders meeting was held on October 3, 2018 at 3:00 p.m. Ms. Messick explained that there was around twelve attendees and very good suggestions were discussed. The second meeting will be held in December.

Chairman Reaves continued by calling for discussion of the Public Participation Plan Update. Ms. Messick explained that this plan is usually updated every four years and it has now been five since it was last updated. She stated that there will be a 45 day public involvement period that will start after the holidays.

Next, Chairman Reaves continued by calling for discussion of Federal-aid eligibility for commercial motor vehicle parking. Ms. Messick gave the members a handout for review and explained to them that she was available to assist any municipality that needed to update their commercial parking.

The next CAC meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, January 16, 2019, at 10:00 a.m. in the EARPDC 3<sup>rd</sup> floor Conference Room.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 11:01 a.m.

#### **RESOLUTION #774**

### Adoption and Support of New Statewide Safety Performance Management (PM1) Targets

WHEREAS, federal regulations require that the Metropolitan Transportation Plans and Transportation Improvement Programs include Safety Performance Management (PM1) Targets for urbanized areas and;

WHEREAS, the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) of the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) in coordination with the Federal Highway Administration and the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) has reviewed the requirement to adopt Safety Performance Management (PM1) Targets for use in the transportation process as required by 23 CFR 490.105;

WHEREAS, the TAC at its January 9, 2019 meeting recommended that Calhoun Area MPO adopt and support the Safety Performance Management (PM1) Targets approved by the ALDOT:

### • Number of Serious Injuries: Performance Target: 8469

This analysis determined the fatality trend line plus a 1.7% increase associated with GDP correlated with the currently observed trends of fatal, serious injury, and non-motorized crashes. This target supports the SHSP by helping Alabama focus its strategy, or direction, and making decisions on allocating its resources to reduce long-term serious injury trends.

### • Rate of Serious Injuries: Performance Target: 12.080

This performance target was developed using the serious injuries trend line plus a 1.7% increase associated with GDP and an estimated vehicle miles traveled (VMT) growth of 1%. The target represents the projected serious injuries as a ratio to 100 million VMT. This target supports the SHSP by helping Alabama focus its strategy, or direction, and making decisions on allocating its resources to reduce long-term serious injury rate trends.

### • Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Serious Injuries: Performance Target: 394

This performance target was developed through a trend line analysis of the five-year moving average for non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries, Alabama unemployment rate trend, and Alabama Gross Domestic Product (GDP) trend. This analysis determined the non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries trend line plus a 1.7% increase associated with GDP correlated with the currently observed trends of non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries. This target supports the SHSP by helping Alabama focus its strategy, or direction, and making decisions on allocating its resources to reduce long-term non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries trends.




