The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Mr. Dennis Reaves, Chair.

There were no new attendees when called to order, so no introductions were needed.

# **OLD BUSINESS:**

Minutes of the CAC meetings from March 20, 2019, were approved on a motion by Mr. Buford Parker and seconded by Mr. Darryl League. Motion carried.

Chairman Reaves called for discussion of April's Administrative Modifications and Resolutions. Ms. Libby Messick explained that there was a list of modifications in the agenda packet to review that were discussed and approved during the month of April to keep the members of the CAC up to date. There were five modifications that created changes to the TIP and four that did not create changes. Ms. Messick also stated that there were two resolutions adopted during April, which were also given to the members for review.

Mr. Dennis Reaves asked about the specifics of project number 35, Noble Street and 4<sup>th</sup> Street intersection improvements and resurface. Ms. Messick explained they would be improving the intersection for right turns onto 4<sup>th</sup> street going towards the multi-modal center.

Mr. Dennis Reaves began a discussion regarding the number of traffic lights that may be unnecessary in the city of Anniston. He proposed the CAC to submit a list of unnecessary lights to the city of Anniston as a recommendation for removal.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

Chairman Reaves called for the Review of FY 16-19 TIP Update and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Libby Messick gave the members a copy of the current TIP, also a list of the ALDOT modifications for this month and briefly reviewed it with them. She stated that there was only one modification that created a change to the TIP, but it was less than 20%, therefore no resolution was required, and there was also one modification that did not create any changes to the TIP.

Next, Chairman Reaves called for discussion of Resolution No. 782 Metropolitan Transportation Planning Self-Certification. Ms. Messick explained that this self-certification occurs every 4 years when the TIP is updated to ensure the MPOs transportation planning process follows all necessary federal requirements. A copy of the self-certification's questionnaire with all the MPOs answers was included in the packet. A motion was made by Mr. Ed Kimbrough to approve the self-certification with **Resolution No. 782**, which was seconded by Mr. Darryl League. Motion carried and this resolution will be presented at the next MPO meeting for consideration.

Chairman Reaves then called for discussion of Resolution No. 783 Deletion of PE and CN from project #42, 9<sup>th</sup> St and Caffey Drive Resurface. Ms. Messick the city of Oxford has requested this project be deleted to free MPO funding for other projects and that a public meeting will be held afterwards for any questions or comments from the public regarding this deletion. A motion was made by Mr. Darryl League to approve the deletion with **Resolution No. 783**, which was seconded by Mr. Tim Huddleston. Motion carried and this resolution will be presented at the next MPO meeting for consideration.

Chairman Reaves then called for discussion of Resolution No. 784 Reduction of Limits for project #14, Alexandria/Jacksonville Rd. Ms. Messick explained that this resolution was requested by Calhoun County and would reduce the limits from 6.29 miles to 2.502 miles. The remaining 3.788 will be programmed as a project in the upcoming TIP. A motion was made by Dr. Mike Kimberly to approve the limit reduction with **Resolution No. 784**, which was seconded by Mr. Darryl League. Motion carried and this resolution will be presented at the next MPO meeting for consideration.

Next, Chairman Reaves called for discussion of Resolution No. 785 Reclassification of Ossington Avenue. Ms. Messick explained that this resolution was requested by the city of Anniston. It would start a request from the MPO to ALDOT and FHWA once traffic counts and justification of reclassification was submitted. Ms. Messick further explained an increase in classification would make Ossington Avenue eligible for MPO projects and funds. Mr. Ed

Kimbrough asked if the MDA was aware of the request. Ms. Messick stated a separate resolution had been passed by the Anniston City Council for this request. A motion was made by Mr. Tim Huddleston to recommend **Resolution No. 785** be tabled until there is evidentiary proof that the MDA is in support of the resolution, which was seconded by Mr. Rick Robins. Motion carried and the recommendation that this resolution be tabled will be presented at the next MPO meeting for consideration.

Chairman Reaves continued by calling for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of current construction projects in the agenda packet and briefly reviewed it with them.

Next, Chairman Reaves continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of previous observations in the agenda packet for review. She explained there were a few updates from this list: items 4 conflicts with item 1 and 3 conflicts with safety concerns regarding traffic coming out of the roads that intersect with SR-21. Item number 10 was a new item brought forth from 2 previous MPO meetings, at the last MPO meeting Jay Jenkins stated he had brought it to the attention to Anniston's Public Works.

Chairman Reaves continued by calling for discussion of the STIP Formal Amendment Public Meeting. Ms. Messick explained that the meeting would be held on May 15<sup>th</sup> directly after this meeting regarding the two deletion of 9<sup>th</sup> and Caffey resurfacing project and reduction of limits to the Alexandria/Jacksonville Rd. resurfacing project discussed previously.

Next, Chairman Reaves continued by calling for discussion of the STIP Public Meeting. Ms. Messick explained that the meeting would be held on May 16<sup>th</sup> after the MPO meeting and she would notify them of a time when it was established.

### **OTHER BUSINESS:**

Chairman Reaves called for the report on Anniston Express and ADA Para-Transit Ridership. Ms. Messick stated that the last two pages in the agenda pack are graphs to review and explained that there was a total of 9,045 fixed-route riders for April which was an increase from last month and an increase from last year. For the ADA Paratransit Ridership for April; Anniston had 928 (increase) one-way trips, Jacksonville had 190 (increase) one-way trips, 25 (decrease) trips for Weaver, and Oxford had 126 (decrease) one-way trips. For the Urbanized area 241 (decrease) one-way trips and 228 (increase) one-way trips for the Rural area.

Next, Chairman Reaves called for discussion of CAC vacancies. Mr. Reeves stated if you know someone who would be interested in serving on the committee to bring their name to the vacancy subcommittee which will send the recommendation to the respective mayors. Anniston has 6 vacancies, Oxford has 5, Weaver, Anniston Army Depot, and Hobson City have 1 vacancy each.

Chairman Reaves called for the Update on Bicycle/Pedestrian Plan. Ms. Messick explained that final comments had been received and the plan should be finalized once the comments have been addressed. The final review and approval will be in June.

The next CAC meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, July 17, 2019, at 10:00 a.m. in the EARPDC  $3^{rd}$  floor Conference Room.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:51 a.m.
