The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. by Mr. Miller Parnell, Vice Chair.

OLD BUSINESS:

Minutes of the CAC meetings from September 16, 2020, were approved on a motion by Mr. Red Etheridge and seconded by Mr. Bruce Britton. Motion carried.

Vice Chairman Parnell called for discussion of October 2020 Administrative Modifications and Resolutions. Ms. Libby Messick explained that there was a list of modifications in the agenda packet to review that were discussed during the month of October to keep the members of the CAC up to date. There were no modifications that created changes to the TIP and five modifications that did not create changes to the TIP spreadsheet in December. Ms. Messick also stated that there were 4 resolutions adopted in October which were also included in the agenda packet.

<u>NEW BUSINESS:</u>

Vice Chairman Parnell called for the Review of FY 20-23 TIP Update and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Libby Messick gave the members a copy of the current TIP. There were two administrative modifications that made changes to the TIP Spreadsheet and no administrative modifications that did not create changes to the spreadsheet.

Vice Chairman Parnell continued by calling for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of current construction projects in the agenda packet and briefly reviewed it with them.

Next, Vice Chairman Parnell continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of previous observations in the agenda packet for review and no updates at this time.

Vice Chairman Parnell called for discussion of the CAC letter to the City of Anniston. The letter was drafted by Mr. Tim Huddleston regarding a recommendation for signage near the US-431 and Highway 21 intersection indicating restaurants and other businesses off the 431 exit. Ms. Messick read the letter to those attending as it was added to the agenda after mailed items were sent. Motion to approve and send the letter was made by Mr. Bruce Britton and seconded by Mr. Rick Robins. Motion carried.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Vice Chairman Parnell called for discussion of CAC vacancies. Anniston has 7 vacancies, Jacksonville has 2, Oxford has 7, and Weaver has 1 vacancy.

Next, Vice Chairman Parnell called for the report on Anniston Express and ADA Para-Transit Ridership. Ms. Messick stated that the next two page in the agenda pack are graphs to review and explained the ADA Paratransit Ridership for October; Anniston had 663 one-way trips, Jacksonville had 158 one-way trips, 66 trips for Weaver, and Oxford had 188 one-way trips. For the Urbanized area 139 one-way trips and 155 one-way trips for the Rural area. Fixed-route ridership had a total of 5,541 riders for the month of October.

The next CAC meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, January 20, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. either in the EARPDC 3rd floor Conference Room or via teleconference again if still maintaining social distancing.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Mr. Buford Parker and seconded by Mr. George Salmon to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 10:35 a.m.
