The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Mr. Dennis Reaves, Chair.

There were no new attendees when called to order.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

Minutes of the CAC meeting from November 20, 2019, were approved on a motion by Mr. Jamie Etheredge and seconded by Mr. Tim Huddleston. Motion carried.

Chairman Reaves called for discussion of December 2019 Administrative Modifications and Resolutions. Ms. Libby Messick explained that there was a list of modifications in the agenda packet to review that were discussed during the month of December to keep the members of the CAC up to date. There were no modifications that created changes to the TIP and one modification that did not create changes to the TIP spreadsheet. Ms. Messick also stated that there was one resolution adopted during December, which was also given to the members for review.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

Chairman Reaves called for the Review of FY 20-23 TIP Update and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Messick gave the members handouts of the list of MPO projects and reviewed the Administrative Modifications for the month. Ms. Messick explained that there were two modifications that created changes on the TIP spreadsheet and four modifications that did not create any changes to the TIP spreadsheet.

Next, Chairman Reaves called for discussion of Resolution No. 796 Adoption and Support of Statewide Safety Performance Management (PM1) Targets. The resolution is to adopt and support the new statewide safety performance management (PM1) targets. These targets are set from data on a 5-year rolling average and adopted by ALDOT each year. Instead of creating targets, the MPO has elected to support ALDOT's targets. Ms. Messick provided additional handouts that included crash data for the MPO area to support the MPOs support of these targets. A motion was made by Mr. Tim Huddleston to approve **Resolution No. 796**, which was seconded by Mr. Chris Gann. Motion carried and this resolution will be presented at the next MPO meeting for consideration.

Chairman Reaves then called for discussion of Resolution No. 797 to amend the FY 2020 – 2023 STIP and TIP. This resolution would project number 100061470 and add project numbers 100061463 and 100049969. These projects do not include any MPO funds; however, they do occur in the TIP and STIP with federal and state funds. A motion was made by Mr. Ed Kimbrough to approve **Resolution No. 797**, which was seconded by Mr. Tim Huddleston. Motion carried and this resolution will be presented at the next MPO meeting for consideration.

Chairman Reaves continued by calling for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of current construction projects in the agenda packet and briefly reviewed it with them.

Next, Chairman Reaves continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that there was a handout in the agenda packet with the list of concerns from the CAC that had been discussed at previous meetings for review. She explained there were no updates to be given at this time. Mr. Reeves proposed the Oxford members attend a city council meeting to see if there had been further discussion about the lighting issue at Bynum Blvd and 202 intersection. Mr. Kimbrough asked about safety measures that could be implemented at the intersection of SR-21 and the west-bound 431 exit ramp. This matter will be added to the Safety Observations list.

Chairman Reaves called for further discussion of the East Alabama Coordinated Public Transit and Human Services Transportation Plan 2020 – 2023 review. Ms. Messick explained an extra handout with the agenda packets for just the section for Calhoun County. The draft is on the website if anyone would like to review the full document. She asked for comments or additions

within the next two to three weeks. A final copy of the plan should be available for review next month.

**OTHER BUSINESS:**

Chairman Reaves called for discussion of CAC vacancies. Anniston has 6 vacancies, Oxford has 5, Weaver and ALDOT have 1 vacancy each. Ms. Messick gave contact information to the membership subcommittee that was created at the previous meeting. An additional handout with each member and attendance percentage for the previous year was also listed.

Chairman Reaves called for the report on Anniston Express and ADA Para-Transit Ridership. Ms. Messick stated that the last two pages in the agenda pack are graphs to review and explained that there were 7,596 passengers on the Fixed-Route which was an increase from the previous month and decrease from the previous year. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of December. There were 784 trips for the City of Anniston (increase), 222 trips for the City of Jacksonville (increase), 59 trips for the City of Weaver (increase), 160 trips for the City of Oxford (increase), 82 trips for the Urbanized part of the County (decrease) and 226 trips for the Rural part of the County (increase).

The next CAC meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, March 18, 2020, at 10:00 a.m. in the EARPDC 3<sup>rd</sup> floor Conference Room.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:35 a.m.


