MINUTES

CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE (CAC) of the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Wednesday, November 20, 2019 10:00 a.m.

The meeting was called to order at 9:58 a.m. by Mr. Dennis Reaves, Chair.

There was one new attendee when called to order. Chairman Reeves introduced Bob Woodfin from Calhoun County.

OLD BUSINESS:

Minutes of the CAC meeting from September 18, 2019, were approved on a motion by Mr. Miller Parnell and seconded by Mr. Rick Robins. Motion carried.

Chairman Reaves called for discussion of October's Administrative Modifications and Resolutions. Ms. Libby Messick explained that there was a list of modifications in the agenda packet to review that were discussed during the month of October to keep the members of the CAC up to date. There were no modifications that created changes to the TIP and three that did not create changes. Ms. Messick also stated that there were no resolutions adopted during October, which were also given to the members for review.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chairman Reaves called for the Review of FY 20-23 TIP Update and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Messick gave the members handouts of the list of MPO projects and reviewed the Administrative Modifications for the month. Ms. Messick explained that there were two modifications that created changes on the TIP spreadsheet and I modification that did not create any changes to the TIP spreadsheet.

Next, Chairman Reaves called for discussion of Resolution No. 792 Classification of Eulaton Gate Road. Ms. Messick explained this was a correction to the resolution passed when the CAC last met. The previous resolution had the classification as a minor collector when it should have been major collector. A motion was made by Mr. Tim Huddleston to approve **Resolution No.** 792, which was seconded by Mr. Chris Gann. Motion carried and this resolution will be presented at the next MPO meeting for consideration.

Chairman Reaves then called for discussion of Resolution No. 794 Amending the Fiscal Year 2020 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). Ms. Messick explained this resolution would add additional PL funds awarded to the City of Anniston and the MPO for an update to the McClellan Traffic Plan in the amount of \$46,815. Ms. Messick provided the updated pages of the UPWP which exhibited a new task 6.1 as well as the breakdown of federal and local match for the City of Anniston only for the plan update. A motion was made by Mr. Tim Huddleston to approve **Résolution No. 793**, which was seconded by Mr. Darryl League. Motion carried and this resolution will be presented at the next MPO meeting for consideration.

Chairman Reaves continued by calling for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of current construction projects in the agenda packet and briefly reviewed it with them.

Next, Chairman Reaves continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that there was a handout in the agenda packet with the list of concerns from the CAC that had been discussed at previous meetings for review. She reviewed the most recently updated items. Item #1 is still waiting on the power company. Item #6 was updated that Anniston has got the process started with Alabama Power. Item #8 is still stagnant and would need to discuss the issue more. Ms. Messick updated with item #11 with the traffic study is still ongoing. Item #16 the timing had been investigated and it is functioning as intended; this item is now in closed status. The newest item, #17, submitted by Mr. Theodore Smart was updated by the TAC that the issue had been investigated and there is a possible resolution presented to the Commissioner. Mr. Theo explained where the turning lane was needed on Bynum Leatherwood Rd to get into the landfill. Mr. Miller explained more about item #12, widening US-78 east of the 431-bypass towards Sunny King Honda and the RV lot to three lanes. Ms. Messick explained that the Long Range Plan is in process and the traffic counts for this area and any warrant for a widening in this area would be in consideration for the long-range.

Chairman Reaves called for further discussion regarding possibly moving the CAC meetings to fall before the TAC and Policy meetings. Mr. Tim Huddleston had suggested moving CAC meetings back a week as to not meet the day before the MPO meeting. Ms. Messick explained that some months in which the month starts on a Thursday, the TAC meeting is technically held on the first Wednesday. She suggested if they were to move the CAC meetings earlier to schedule them for the first Thursday instead. No motion made for changing the meeting dates was made.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Chairman Reaves called for discussion of CAC vacancies. Anniston has 6 vacancies, Oxford has 5, Weaver and ALDOT have 1 vacancy each. Mr. Tim Huddleston made a motion to create a membership subcommittee with one member from each municipality so that each of these appointees would not only suggest others to be appointed by their mayor but could also review non-active members. Rick Robins seconded the motion. Mr. Jamie Etheridge volunteered to be the representative for Jacksonville, Mr. Tim Huddleston for Calhoun County, Mr. Miller Parnell for Anniston, Darryl League for Oxford, Mr. Rick Robins for Weaver, and Mr. Joe Cunningham for Hobson City.

Chairman Reaves called for the report on Anniston Express and ADA Para-Transit Ridership. Ms. Messick stated that the last two pages in the agenda pack are graphs to review and explained that there were 8,871 passengers on the Fixed-Route which was an increase from the previous month and decrease from the previous year. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of October. There were 903 trips for the City of Anniston (increase), 222 trips for the City of Jacksonville (increase), 59 trips for the City of Weaver (increase), 160 trips for the City of Oxford (increase), 82 trips for the Urbanized part of the County (decrease) and 226 trips for the Rural part of the County (increase).

The next CAC meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, January 15, 2020, at 10:00 a.m. in the EARPDC 3rd floor Conference Room.

Ms. Messick also reminded those in attendance and interested in the US-431 project that ALDOT would be having a public meeting the following day at 4 p.m. at the Saks Community Center. This would be the second public meeting for this project.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:53 a.m.



RESOLUTION #796

Adoption and Support of New Statewide Safety Performance Management (PM1) Targets

WHEREAS, federal regulations require that the Metropolitan Transportation Plans and Transportation Improvement Programs include Safety Performance Management (PMI) Targets for urbanized areas and;

WHEREAS, the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) of the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) in coordination with the Federal Highway Administration and the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) has reviewed the requirement to adopt Safety Performance Management (PMI) Targets for use in the transportation process as required by 23 CFR 490.105;

WHEREAS, the TAC at its January 8, 2020 meeting recommended that Calhoun Area MPO adopt and support the Safety Performance Management (PM1) Targets approved by the ALDOT:

• Number of Fatalities: Performance Target: 964

This performance target was developed through a trend line analysis of the five-year moving average for fatalities, Alabama unemployment rate trend, and Alabama Gross Domestic Product (GDP) trend. This analysis determined the fatality trend line plus a 1.7% increase associated with GDP correlated with the currently observed trends of fatal, serious injury, and non-motorized crashes. This target supports the SPSP by helping Alabama focus its strategy, or direction, and making decisions on allocating its resources to reduce long-term fatality trends.

• Rate of Fatalities: Performance Target 1.35

This performance target was developed using the fatality trend line plus a 1.7% increase associated with GDP and an estimated vehicle miles traveled (VMT) growth of 1%. The target represents the projected fatalities as a ratio to 100 million VMT. This target supports the SHSP by helping Alabama focus its strategy, or direction, and making decisions on allocating its resources to reduce long-term fatality rate trends. This performance larget was developed through a trend line analysis of the five-year moving average for serious injuries, Alabama unemployment rate trend, and Alabama Gross Domestic Product (GDP) trend. This analysis determined the fatality trend line plus a 1.7% increase associated with GDP correlated with the currently observed trends of fatal, serious injury, and non-motorized crashes. This target supports the SHSP by helping Alabama focus its strategy, or direction, and making decisions on allocating its resources to reduce long-term serious injury trends.

• Number of Serious Injuries: Performance Target: 8143

This performance target was developed through a trend line analysis of the five-year moving average for serious injuries, Alabama unemployment rate trend, and Alabama Gross Domestic Product (GDP) trend. This analysis determined the fatality trend line plus a 1.7% increase associated with GDP correlated with the currently observed trends of fatal, serious injury, and non-motorized crashes. This target supports the SHSP by helping Alabama focus its strategy, or direction, and making decisions on allocating its resources to reduce long-term serious injury trends.

Rate of Serious Injuries: Performance Target: 11.08

This performance target was developed using the serious injuries trend line plus a 1.7% increase associated with GDP and an estimated vehicle miles traveled (VMT) growth of 1%. The target represents the projected serious injuries as a ratio to 100 million VMT. This target supports the SHSP by helping Alabama focus its strategy, or direction, and making decisions on allocating its resources to reduce long-term serious injury rate trends.

• Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Serious Injuries: Performance Target: 384

This performance target was developed through a trend line analysis of the five-year moving average for non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries, Alabama unemployment rate trend, and Alabama Gross Domestic Product (GDP) trend. This analysis determined the non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries trend line plus a 1.7% increase associated with GDP correlated with the currently observed trends of non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries. This target supports the SHSP by helping Alabama focus its strategy, or direction, and making decisions on allocating its resources to reduce long-term non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries trends.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Calhoun Area MPO Policy Committee concurs with the recommendation of the TAC and hereby adopts and supports the Statewide Safety Performance Management (PM1) Targets as approved by the ALDOT
