The meeting was called to order at 10:01 a.m. by Mr. Dennis Reaves, Chairman.

OLD BUSINESS:

Minutes of the CAC meetings from January 20, 2021, were approved on a motion by Mr. Tim Huddleston and seconded by Mr. Theo Smart. Motion carried.

Chairman Reaves called for discussion of February 2021 Administrative Modifications and Resolutions. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of modifications in the agenda packet to review that were discussed during the month of February to keep the members of the CAC up to date. There were two modifications that created changes to the TIP and six modifications that did not create changes to the TIP spreadsheet in February. Ms. Messick also stated that there were three resolutions adopted in February which were also included in the agenda packet.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chairman Reaves called for the Review of FY 20-23 TIP Update and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Messick gave the members a copy of the current TIP. There were no

administrative modifications that made changes to the TIP Spreadsheet and no administrative modifications that did not create changes to the spreadsheet.

Chairman Reaves continued by calling for discussion of Resolution No. 817. Ms. Messick this resolution was to amend the 2019 Bike-Ped plan to add an Appendix D that included Trail Economic Impacts for Calhoun County. She further explained the updated SCORP also included an economic impact, so this would better reflect that plan. A motion was made by Mr. Tim Huddleston to approve the amendment with Resolution No. 817, which was seconded by Mr. Miller Parnell. Motion carried.

Chairman Reaves next called for discussion of Resolution No. 818. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was to amend the current FY UPWP to allocate \$160,680 in remaining funds from the previous year's UPWP. She further explained \$27,887 would be allocated to Task 6.3 which was for Anniston's Bike-Ped plan update and feasibility studies for CLT/Coldwater connectivity. The remaining funds would be placed in Task 6.2 as a catch all for any special studies that the municipalities may want to have done as well as to save for large plans such as the LRTP A motion was made by Mr. Johnnie Phillips to approve the addition of rollover funds with Resolution No. 818, which was seconded by Mr. Rick Robins. Motion carried.

Chairman Reaves then called for discussion of Resolution No. 819. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was to support a letter of disagreement with the recommendation to the OMB to make changes to the 2010 standards for delineating Metro and Micropolitan Statistical Areas. Ms. Messick included the letter to be submitted during the comment period and noted the major change was to denote urban areas as those with a population of 100,000 instead of the current 50,000. This had the potential to affect 7 out of 12 MPOs in Alabama. A motion was made by Mr. Tim Huddleston to approve the MPO letter and comments to OMB with Resolution No. 814, which was seconded by Mr. Lavoy Jordan. Motion carried.

Chairman Reaves then called for discussion of Resolution No. 820. Ms. Messick explained She explained this resolution was to certify the FY 21 ADA Para-transit Implementation Plan Update which is a yearly update performed by ACTS. A motion was made by Mr. Theo Smart to approve the updated plan with Resolution No. 820, which was seconded by Mr. Miller Parnell. Motion carried.

Chairman Reaves next called for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of current construction projects in the agenda packet and briefly reviewed it with them.

Next, Chairman Reaves continued by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of previous observations in the agenda packet for review and the only update was the City of Anniston had requested a traffic study by ALDOT for item number 21 at the intersection of 10th and South Quintard. The letter from the City of Anniston was included in the packet. Two new items were added to the list: The intersection at 21 and

Greenbriar northbound turn signal is used less frequently than the southbound, and traffic stacking at the intersection of 21 and 78 due to possible signal timing at the intersection of 21 and I-20 or Cheaha Drive.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Chairman Reaves called for discussion of CAC vacancies. Anniston has 7 vacancies, Jacksonville has 2, Oxford has 7, and Weaver has 1 vacancy.

Next, Chairman Reaves called for the report on Anniston Express and ADA Para-Transit Ridership. Ms. Messick stated that the next two page in the agenda pack are graphs to review and explained the ADA Paratransit Ridership for February. Anniston had 563 (decrease) one-way trips, Jacksonville had 106 (increase) one-way trips, 56 trips for Weaver (decrease), and Oxford had 126 (decrease) one-way trips. For the Urbanized area 82 (decrease) one-way trips and 98 (increase) one-way trips for the Rural area. Fixed-route ridership had a total of 4,773 (decrease) riders for the month of February.

The next CAC meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, May 19, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. either in the EARPDC 3rd floor Conference Room or via teleconference again if still maintaining social distancing.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Mr. Tim Huddleston and seconded by several other committee members at once to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 10:45 a.m.
