After roll call was taken and it was determined that a quorum was present, Chairman, Councilman Jerry Parris called the meeting to order at 10:04 a.m.

OLD BUSINESS:

The minutes of the December 20, 2018 meeting were approved on a motion made by Mayor Wayne Willis and seconded by Mr. Fred Denney. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chairman Parris called for the Review of FY 16-19 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Libby Messick gave the members a copy of the current TIP and also a list of the ALDoT modifications for this month and briefly reviewed it with them. Ms. Messick explained that there were two admin modifications that created changes to the TIP spreadsheet, but none needed a resolution for approval. She also stated that there was one modification that did not create changes to the TIP.

Next, Chairman Parris called for discussion of Resolution No. 774 PM1 Safety Performance Management Targets. Ms. Messick explained that this target is to measure injuries and fatalities for the MPO urbanized area. A motion was made by Mr. Jay Jenkins to approve this PM1 with **Resolution No.** 774, which was seconded by Mr. Toby Bennington. Motion carried.

Chairman Parris continued by calling for discussion of Resolution No. 775 Increase PE and CN allocations for project #41 Airport Rd. Bridge Replacement. Ms. Messick explained that the City of Oxford had requested to increase the PE by \$115,890 bringing the allocation to \$340.890 and the CN by \$1,183,620 bringing it to \$2,101,710. A motion was made by Mr. Toby Bennington to approve this request with **Resolution No.** 775, which was seconded by Mr. Jeff Clendenning. Motion carried.

Next, Chairman Parris continued with New Business by calling for discussion of CAC Appointments. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of the members in the agenda packet to review. The City of Anniston still needs 6 appointments, 5 for the City of Oxford, 1 Trucking Representative, 1 for the Anniston Army Depot, 1 for the Town of Hobson City, and 1 for the ALDoT Local Transportation Bureau.

Chairman Parris continued by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that in the agenda packet is a list of concerns from the Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC) for review. She stated that she had added a new item, #9 for the City of Weaver, sidewalk rehabilitation in front of the 1st Baptist Church. Mayor Willis said that he would look into it.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Chairman Parris called for the status report on other local projects from ALDoT East Central Division. Mr. Shannon Jones gave a report on the local sponsored projects which was provided as a handout for review and Mr. Steven Corley gave an update on the ALDoT sponsored projects.

Chairman Parris continued by calling for an Update of the Bicycle-Pedestrian Plan. Ms. Messick gave the members a copy of the proposed Bicycle and Pedestrian Projects that are broken out by jurisdiction for review. Mr. John Gardner from JRWA was present to answer any questions.

Next, Chairman Parris called for discussion of the Public Participation Plan Update. Ms. Messick explained that the public meeting was yesterday, January 16th, and that comments would be accepted through February 19th so that the plan update could be presented to the MPO on the 20th for consideration of adoption.

Chairman Parris called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick gave the report for the Fixed-Route ridership for the month of December, which was provided in the agenda packet for review. There were 8,082 passengers on the Fixed-Route during December. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of December. There were 748 trips for the City of Anniston, 180 trips for the City of

Jacksonville, 22 trips for the City of Weaver, 127 trips for the City of Oxford, 232 trips for the Urbanized part of the County and 171 trips for the Rural part of the County.

Chairman Parris called for comments or issues from member jurisdictions or attendees. There were none at this time.

Next meeting of the MPO will be Thursday, February 21, 2019 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no further business, Chairman Parris adjourned the meeting at 10:23 a.m.

WHEREAS, the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is the organization designated by the Governor of the State of Alabama as being responsible, together with the State of Alabama, for implementing the applicable provisions of 23 USC 134 and 135 (amended by the FAST Act, Sections 1201 and 1202, December 2015); 42 USC 2000d-1, 7401; 23 CFR 450 and 500; 40 CFR 51 and 93; and,

WHEREAS, the US Department of Transportation (USDOT) requires all urbanized areas, as established by the US Bureau of the Census, to do area-wide urban transportation planning, and the designated planning organization to submit a Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) as a condition for meeting the provisions of Title 23 USC 134; and,

WHEREAS, consistent with the declaration of these provisions, the East Alabama Regional Planning and Development Commission, as staff to the MPO, in cooperation with the Bureau of Transportation Planning and Modal Programs, Alabama Department of Transportation, has prepared a Unified Planning Work Program for Fiscal Year 2019; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to its duties, functions, and responsibilities, the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) proposes to allocate the remaining administrative funds from fiscal years 2018 and 2016 in the amount of \$95,667 into fiscal year 2019 in order to hire a consultant to update the Calhoun Area MPO Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP); now,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), that the fiscal year 2019 UPWP be amended as indicated above.
