After roll call was taken and it was determined that a quorum was present, Chairman, Councilman Jerry Parris called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m.

OLD BUSINESS:

The minutes of the January 17, 2019 meeting were approved on a motion made by Mr. Toby Bennington and seconded by Mr. Jeff Clendenning. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chairman Parris called for the Review of FY 16-19 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Libby Messick gave the members a copy of the current TIP and also a list of the ALDoT modifications for this month and briefly reviewed it with them. Ms. Messick explained that there were two admin modifications that created changes to the TIP spreadsheet, but none

needed a resolution for approval. She also stated that there were two modifications that did not create changes to the TIP. Mr. Toby Bennington stated that #2 of the admin modifications states that \$8,243 on project #35 UT will be added back into the balance of funds for the MPO, but it was supposed to be rolled into the CN allocation of the same project.

Next, Chairman Parris called for discussion of Resolution No. 776 Amend FY 19 UPWP. Ms. Messick explained that this will allocate the remaining administrative funds from fiscal years 2018 and 2016 in the amount of \$95,667 into fiscal year 2019 in order to hire a consultant to update the Calhoun Area MPO Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) which is due next year. A motion was made by Mr. Mark Stephens to approve this amendment with **Resolution No. 776**, which was seconded by Mr. Toby Bennington. Motion carried.

Chairman Parris continued by calling for discussion of Resolution No. 777 Adoption of the FY 19 Public Participation Plan. Ms. Messick explained that the MPO had provided a public comment period of 45 days from January 3rd to February 19th and there were no comments and only minor adjustments from the ALDoT made to the plan. A motion was made by Mr. Jeff Clendenning to adopt the plan with **Resolution No. 777**, which was seconded by Mr. Fred Denney. Motion carried.

Next, Chairman Parris continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Resolution No. 778 Adoption of the FY 19 ADA Para-Transit Plan Update. Mr. Shane Christian explained that the only changes made to the plan was to update the inventory listing of vehicles and the ridership numbers. A motion was made by Mr. Toby Bennington to adopt the plan with **Resolution No. 778**, which was seconded by Mr. Jeff Clendenning. Motion carried.

Chairman Parris continued by calling for discussion of CAC Appointments. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of the members in the agenda packet to review. The City of Anniston still needs 6 appointments, 5 for the City of Oxford including 1 Trucking Representative, 1 for the Anniston Army Depot, 1 for the Town of Hobson City, and 1 for the ALDoT Local Transportation Bureau.

Next, Chairman Parris continued by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that in the agenda packet is a list of concerns from the Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC) for review. There have been no additions to the list since last month.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Chairman Parris called for the status report on other local projects from ALDoT East Central Division. Mr. Shannon Jones gave a report on the local sponsored projects which was provided as a handout for review and Mr. Steven Corley gave an update on the ALDoT sponsored projects.

Chairman Parris continued by calling for an Update of the Bicycle-Pedestrian Plan. Ms. Messick stated that there was a public meeting scheduled for today starting at 4:00 and that there would be a presentation at 5:00. Mr. John Gardner from JRWA was present to answer any questions.

Next, Chairman Parris called for discussion of the FY 20-23 TIP Projects and LRTP included Projects. Ms. Messick explained that there was handout in the agenda packet with a listing of projects for review.

Chairman Parris called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick gave the report for the Fixed-Route ridership for the month of January, which was provided in the agenda packet for review. There were 8,239 passengers on the Fixed-Route during January. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of January. There were 735 trips for the City of Anniston, 215 trips for the City of Jacksonville, 17 trips for the City of Weaver, 157 trips for the City of Oxford, 323 trips for the Urbanized part of the County and 234 trips for the Rural part of the County.

Chairman Parris called for comments or issues from member jurisdictions or attendees. There were none at this time.

Next meeting of the MPO will be Thursday, March 21, 2019 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no further business, Chairman Parris adjourned the meeting at 10:17 a.m.


PROJECT DESCRIPTION: INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS AT NOBLE STREET AND 4TH STREET (#35)
