After roll call was taken and it was determined that a quorum was present, Chairman, Councilman Jerry Parris called the meeting to order at 10:10 a.m.

OLD BUSINESS:

The minutes of the February 21, 2019 meeting were approved on a motion made by Mr. Fred Denney and seconded by Mr. Jay Jenkins. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chairman Parris called for the Review of FY 16-19 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Libby Messick gave the members a copy of the current TIP and also a list of the ALDoT modifications for this month and briefly reviewed it with them. Ms. Messick explained that there was one admin modification that created a change to the TIP spreadsheet. She explained that after researching the engineers estimate for project #39 CN, she found that Resolution No. 772 that was passed back on December 20, 2018 increased the allocation to \$484,694, which is higher than the suggested allocation change for this month. So therefore, it will be corrected. She also stated that there were five modifications that did not create changes to the TIP.

Next, Chairman Parris called for discussion of Resolution No. 779: Increase CN allocation for Project #35. Ms. Messick explained that this will increase the CN allocation of \$257,915.00 to \$580,642.58. A motion was made by Mr. Jay Jenkins to approve this increase with **Resolution No.** 779, which was seconded by Mr. Mark Stephens. Motion carried.

Chairman Parris continued by calling for discussion CAC Appointments. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of the members in the agenda packet to review. The City of Anniston still needs 6 appointments, 5 for the City of Oxford including 1 Trucking Representative, 1 for the City of Weaver, 1 for the Anniston Army Depot, 1 for the Town of Hobson City, and 1 for the ALDoT Local Transportation Bureau.

Next, Chairman Parris continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that in the agenda packet is a list of concerns from the Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC) for review. The only update to the list since last month is for #1, and the City of Oxford will be adding street lights as a city funded project instead of going through the MPO.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Chairman Parris called for the status report on other local projects from ALDoT East Central Division. Mr. Shannon Jones gave a report on the local sponsored projects which was provided as a handout for review.

Next, Chairman Parris continued by calling for an Update of the Bicycle-Pedestrian Plan. Ms. Messick stated that there were no comments given during the public review and that she was still in the process of meeting with each municipality to finalize each section of the plan.

Chairman Parris called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick gave the report for the Fixed-Route ridership for the month of February, which was provided in the agenda packet for review. There were 7,800 passengers on the Fixed-Route during February. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of February. There were 807 trips for the City of Anniston, 151 trips for the City of Jacksonville, 32 trips for the City of Weaver, 132 trips for the City of Oxford, 291 trips for the Urbanized part of the County and 190 trips for the Rural part of the County.

Next, Chairman Parris called for discussion of the Deadline for FY 20-23 TIP Projects. Ms. Messick explained that the deadline to turn in requested projects to be added to the FY 20-13 TIP will be April 1, 2019 so that the TAC and MPO can review them for consideration of approval before they have to be turned in to the ALDoT.

Chairman Parris continued by calling for discussion of the STIP Public meetings. Ms. Messick explained that there would tentatively be a public meeting after the MPO meeting on May 16, 2019 for everyone who would like to attend. She said that the STIP is going through the RPO's for public review this time and has been broken into districts for review.

Chairman Parris called for comments or issues from member jurisdictions or attendees. Mr. Dennis Reaves, CAC Chairman, had questions about the timing of the light at the intersection of AL 202/Quintard Ave. Mr. Jay Jenkins said that he would pass the concern on to the city engineer and let Ms. Messick know a response.

Next meeting of the MPO will be Thursday, April 18, 2019 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no further business, Chairman Parris adjourned the meeting at 10:45 a.m.

April 2019 Administrative Modifications

That created changes on the TIP spreadsheet:

1. #37 PE (100063211) BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS AT 4TH ST., NOBLE ST., 14TH ST., 11TH ST., 18TH ST., AND COBB AVE

Previous TIP Spreadsheet apportionment: \$63,853

Requested Funding: \$55,609

Reason for Request: To increase PE funds to cover the overrun. Project was closed with FHWA for a lesser amount, it had to be reopened to pay a late payment but is still less than previous apportionment (\$63,853).

2. #35 CN (100063208) RESURFACING AND INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS AT 4TH STREET AND NOBLE STREET

Old Engineers Estimate: \$580,642 New Engineers Estimate: \$594,937.54

-Change in estimate equals an increase of \$14,295.54 which is less than 20% of the old estimate (\$116,128.52). No resolution needed for change.

3. #36 PE (100063209) BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS AT CLYDESDALE AVE., 11^{TH} STREET AND 14^{TH} STREET

Current Funding: \$95,744.00 Requested Funding: \$98,041.00

-Change in funding equals an increase of \$2,297 which is less than 20% of current funding (\$19,148.80). Previous spreadsheets have had this funding amount as \$128,334.00, so would be a decrease from previous funding amount on MPO TIP spreadsheets.

4. #14 CN (100064930) RESURFACE ALEXANDRIA-JACKSONVILLE HIGHWAY FROM THE INTERSECTION OF MCCLELLAN ROAD TO THE INTERSECTIN OF CEDAR SPRINGS ROAD – CCP 08-95-16

Old Engineers Estimate: \$1,428,140.00 New Engineers Estimate: \$460,155.96

-Change in funding equals a decrease of \$967,984.04. No resolution needed with decreased estimate changes less than \$1 million.

5. #39 CN (100064884) RESURFACING, STRIPING, AND DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS ON MOUNTAIN STREET NE FROM SR-21 TO 8TH AVENUE NE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE


