After roll call was taken and it was determined that a quorum was present, Chairman, Councilman Jerry Parris called the meeting to order at 10:06 a.m.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

The minutes of the August 15, 2019 meeting were approved on a motion made by Mr. Jay Jenkins and seconded by Mr. Fred Denney. Motion carried.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

Chairman Parris called for the Review of FY 16-19 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Libby Messick gave the members a copy of the current TIP and a list of the ALDOT modifications for August and briefly reviewed it with them. Ms. Messick explained that there were twenty-seven modifications that created changes on the TIP spreadsheet, twenty-six of which were minor updates to the new TIP projects as there were programmed by ALDOT, and 1 modification that did create any changes to the TIP spreadsheet.

Next, Chairman Parris called for discussion of Resolution No. 792. Classification of Eulaton Gate Road. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was via Calhoun County request to concur with the reclassification of Eulaton Gate Rd as a minor collector. She further explained that this road is connected to a federally classified road and probably should have been classified when it was previously. Calhoun County had submitted the classification request and the concurrence by the MPO was needed since the road is in the MPO area. A motion was made by Mr. Toby Bennington to approve the classification request with **Resolution No. 792**, which was seconded by Mr. Jay Jenkins. Motion carried.

Next, Chairman Parris called for discussion of Resolution No. 793 Increase CN Funds for Noble/4<sup>th</sup> Street Intersection Improvements and Resurface (100063208). The resolution was via the City of Anniston to request an additional \$27,627.35 above the administrative modification increase from ALDOT of \$187,309.03. She explained this would bring the total allocation for this project to \$879,461.76. She explained the amount requested by the city of Anniston was due to an error on the CE&I portion of the allocation which was currently 10% and should have been 13.63%. Ms. Messick further explained that the CAC had passed this resolution with reservations regarding the large increase to the project. A motion was made by Mr. Jay Jenkins to approve the classification request with **Resolution No. 793**, which was seconded by Mayor Johnny Smith. Motion carried.

Chairman Parris next called for any nominations for MPO Chair and Vice-Chair for the upcoming year. Mr. Toby Bennington made a motion to nominate Jerry Parris for another term as MPO Chair. Mayor Wayne Willis seconded the nomination. Mr. Jay Jenkins motioned for the nominations to be closed. Motion carried. Mayor Wayne Willis made a motion to nominate Jeff Clendenning for another term as MPO Vice-Chair. Mr. Toby Bennington seconded the nomination. Motion carried.

Chairman Parris next called for discussion CAC Appointments. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of the members in the agenda packet to review. The City of Anniston still needs 6 appointments, 5 for the City of Oxford, 1 for the City of Weaver, 1 for the Anniston Army Depot, and 1 for the ALDOT Local Transportation Bureau.

Next, Chairman Parris continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that in the agenda packet is a list of concerns from the Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC) for review. She explained she had closed items #3 and 4 due to safety conflicts with item #1 and a fatal crash recently along SR-21 within the area of suggestion on item #3. Regarding item #11, a traffic study has been started by the MPO and the City of Anniston is currently aware of the suggestion. For items #12-15, Ms. Messick explained that widening roads would be a major undertaking; however, the MPO will take these suggestions into consideration when examining traffic counts and while updating the Long-Range Transportation Plan. For the second part of item #15, Ms. Messick explained that this would be a great candidate for a TAP grant; however, they are on hold for the current year. Yet there is a conference that will take place the following week in which TAP grants are a subject. One of the EARPDC planners has the information given for this item and will be making the case that we have need for grants that provide our children safe routes to school.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS:**

Chairman Parris called for the status report on other local projects from ALDOT East Central Division. Mr. Shane Brown gave a report on the local sponsored projects which was provided as a handout for review.

Chairman Parris called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick gave the report for the Fixed-Route ridership for the month of July, which was provided in the agenda packet for review. There were 9,314 passengers on the Fixed-Route during August which was an increase from the previous month and decrease from the previous year. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of August. Anniston had 854 (increase) one-way trips, Jacksonville had 178 (decrease) one-way trips, 72 (increase) trips for Weaver, and Oxford had 123 (decrease) one-way trips. For the Urbanized area 235 (decrease) one-way trips and 215 (decrease) one-way trips for the Rural area.

Chairman Parris called for comments or issues from member jurisdictions or attendees. There were no comments or issues brought forth.

Next meeting of the MPO will be Thursday, October 17, 2019 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no further business, Chairman Parris adjourned the meeting at 10:22 a.m.

## Rebuild Alabama Act Annual Grant Program Fiscal Year 2020 Program Guidelines

This document contains information regarding the Rebuild Alabama Act (RAA) Annual Grant Program for Fiscal Year (FY) 2020. The RAA Annual Grant Program is administered by the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT). Prospective project-sponsoring governmental agencies are encouraged to thoroughly review this document, as well as the FY 2020 RAA Annual Grant Program Application and FAQ document, when considering developing a project application.

### A. ELIGIBILITY:

Any political subdivision of the State of Alabama (Municipal and County Governments) is eligible to apply for funding under the RAA Annual Grant Program.

Project applications may be submitted for improvements to any road or bridge owned and maintained by the applicant that is open to public traffic.

The final eligibility of applications and proposed project activities will be determined by ALDOT upon evaluation of the application submitted.

### B. COMPETITIVE SELECTION

RAA Annual Grant Program funds are awarded through a competitive project selection process.

### C. PROJECT FUNDING:

The RAA Annual Grant Program was established by Legislative Act #2019-2. The program allocates no less than \$10 million annually to eligible projects as identified by ALDOT during a fiscal year.

The maximum funding provided to any project in FY2020 will be \$250,000.00.

RAA Annual Grant program funding is only available for eligible construction activities. No Preliminary Engineering, Right-of-Way, Utility Relocation, Construction Engineering & Inspection or Materials Testing costs will be eligible.

RAA Annual Grant Program awarded funds will be issued to the sponsoring agency either (1) upon ALDOT's receipt of a Notice of Award from the sponsoring agency to the contractor, or (2) upon ALDOT's receipt of a Purchase Order (PO) from the sponsoring agency issued against a valid, eligible in-place bid contract.

RAA Annual Grant Program awarded funds cannot be transferred to another project and may only be used to fund improvements consistent with the intent of the original project application.

RAA Annual Grant Program funds may be combined with other federal, state or local funds, where allowed by ALDOT. In such cases, the more restrictive funding requirements may apply to all funds utilized, if required by use of the funds.

A sponsoring governmental agency may only submit one project application per application cycle. Each County and Municipality will be viewed as an individual sponsor. Any project submitted by multiple sponsors shall be deemed as the eligible submission for all sponsors.

Sponsors with an active award may not submit another application until the awarded project has been let to contract or a purchase order utilizing a valid, eligible in-place bid contract has been issued.

Other funding sources to supplement RAA Annual Grant Program funds are not required, but projects containing a commitment to provide supplemental funding may be given favorable consideration.

### D. PROJECT PROGRESS:

RAA Annual Grant Program funds are available to sponsoring agencies for a period of one (1) year from the notice of award. Funding awarded to a sponsoring agency not either let to contract or a purchase order issued against a valid, eligible in-place bid contract within one year of the notice of award are subject to rescission.

Any overrun in total project costs above the amount awarded shall be the responsibility of the sponsoring agency.

### E. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS:

Projects must be let to competitive bid. In-place bids may also be utilized as long as those bids were awarded following all required competitive bid laws for eligibility including the RAA. No other method of construction, such as force account, is allowed.

Any costs incurred prior to issuance of a Notice of Award or a Purchase Order are not eligible.

RAA Annual Grant Program funds have reporting requirements. Recipients will be required to furnish any and all requested data to ALDOT or required entities necessary to satisfy reporting requirements of the RAA.

### E. APPLICATION SUBMISSION & SELECTION

Applications must be received or postmarked prior to November 30, 2019.

All sponsoring agencies selected to receive funding for the first round of grant applications shall be notified no later than January 15, 2020.
