After roll call was taken and it was determined that a quorum was present, Vice Chairman, Councilman Jeff Clendenning called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m. There were no new guests.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

The minutes of the September 17, 2020 meeting were approved on a motion made by Mr. Toby Bennington and seconded by Mayor Alberta McCrory. Motion carried.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Vice Chairman Clendenning called for the appointment of the MPO Policy Committee Chair and Vice Chair. Mayor Wayne Willis, Toby Bennington, and Fred Denney volunteered to form a committee for nominations. Committee Chair and Vice Chair nomination, vote, and appointment will occur at next month's policy meeting.

Vice Chairman Clendenning called for the Review of FY 20-23 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Messick gave the members a copy of the current TIP. Ms. Messick explained that there were five modifications that did not create any changes to the TIP spreadsheet.

Vice Chairman Clendenning then called for discussion of Resolution No. 808. This Resolution was for the increase of PE funds for Frank Akers (STMOA-STPOA-0800(215)). Ms. Messick explained that ALDOT has reported an overrun in PE for this project in the amount of \$17,200.21 and the City of Anniston has requested additional MPO funds to cover the overrun. A motion was made by Mr. Fred Denney to approve this increase with **Resolution No. 808**, which was seconded by Mr. Jay Jenkins. Motion carried.

Next, Vice Chairman Clendenning called for discussion of Resolution No. 809. This Resolution was to increase the CN funds for Bynum Leatherwood/Old Gadsden Roundabout. Ms. Messick explained ALDOT has reported an engineers estimate increase of \$221,589.06. Because the increase was greater than 20% a resolution needed to be passed for the increase and has caused the project to extend a month until let. A screenshot of this TIP's funding should the resolution pass was provided. Ms. Messick further explained this resolution passed through the TAC with 1 vote in opposition. A motion was made by Mr. Toby Bennington to approve this increase with **Resolution No. 809**, which was seconded by Mr. Jay Jenkins. Motion carried.

Vice Chairman Clendenning then called for discussion of Resolution No. 810. This Resolution was to adopt the Final 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan. Ms. Messick explained a final run through of the plan would take place October 8, all comments with the exception of late comments received by FHWA have been addressed but these comments would not make changes to the projects on the plan. A motion was made by Mr. Toby Bennington to adopt the LRTP with **Resolution No. 810**, which was seconded by Mr. Fred Denney. Motion carried.

Next, Vice Chairman Clendenning called for discussion of Resolution No. 811. This Resolution was to adopt the Calhoun Area Functional Classification Map. Ms. Messick explained the map has been updated with the classification of Ossington Ave. A motion was made by Mr. Fred Denney to adopt the functional classification map with **Resolution No. 811**, which was seconded by Mayor Alberta McCrory. Motion carried.

Vice Chairman Clendenning next called for discussion CAC Appointments. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of the members in the agenda packet to review. The City of Anniston still needs 6 appointments, 1 for the City of Jacksonville, and 5 for the City of Oxford. Ms. Messick further explained next month's numbers would be different due to updating and removing members who had not attended in the last two years.

Next, Vice Chairman Clendenning continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that there was a handout in the agenda packet with the list of concerns from the CAC that had been discussed at previous meetings for review. There were no new updates available. Mr. Fred Denney provided an update for item 22 that the Police Chief is not in favor of a speed limit increase, but the City Engineer will do a study.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS:**

Vice Chairman Clendenning called for the status report on other local projects from ALDOT East Central Division. Mr. Shane Brown gave a report included in the agenda packet. He detailed bridge painting projects were waiting on punch list items and on-going claims; Mountain Street was on punch list items; milling, widening, and surface treatment is complete on one half of the AL-144 resurfacing and widening from St. Clair County line to US 431 and the upper binder is being placed; storm drain and borrow were being placed on the northbound side of US-431 for the access management project; and SR-21 signal upgrade at Baltzell Gate and Lenlock are awaiting material submittal and approval.

Vice Chairman Clendenning called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick gave the report for the Fixed-Route ridership for the month of September, which was provided in the agenda packet for review. There were 5,923 passengers on the Fixed-Route which was a decrease from the previous month and decrease from the previous year due to COVID-19 restrictions. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of July. There were 715 trips for the City of Anniston (increase), 181 trips for the City of Jacksonville (increase), 65 trips for the City of Weaver (increase), 171 trips for the City of Oxford (increase), 153 trips for the Urbanized part of the County (increase) and 138 trips for the Rural part of the County (increase).

Vice Chairman Clendenning then called for discussion of the Public Involvement for Resolution 805 and the Draft LRTP. Ms. Messick explained a handout was included in the meeting packet with call-in and online access to the virtual public involvement meeting scheduled for September 16 between 11 and 12 after the CAC meeting. A final draft meeting will be held at the same time October 8 and a meeting invite will follow soon.

Vice Chairman Clendenning then called for discussion on Rebuild Alabama Act Annual Grant Program open applications. Ms. Messick explained the guidelines, FAQ, and application was included in the meeting packet. Applications are due by November 30.

Finally, Vice Chairman Clendenning called for comments or issues from member jurisdictions or attendees.

Next meeting of the MPO will be Thursday, November 19, 2020 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no further business, Vice Chairman Clendenning adjourned the meeting at 10:28 a.m.
