After roll call was taken and it was determined that a quorum was present, Vice Chairman Jenkins called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m.

OLD BUSINESS:

The minutes of the June 17, 2021 meeting were approved on a motion made by Mr. Fred Denney and seconded by Mr. Mark Stephens. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chairman Clendenning called for the Review of FY 20-23 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Messick gave the members a copy of the current TIP. Ms. Messick explained that there were three administrative modifications for the month that created changes on the TIP spreadsheet and no administrative modification that did not create a change on the TIP spreadsheet.

Chairman Clendenning then called for discussion of Resolution No. 824. Ms. Messick explained this resolution is adopt the new and amended FTA performance measures and targets. The first set of targets are generated by FTA to reduce inventory of rolling stock that have met or exceed useful life benchmark by 15%, to reduce equipment over \$50k that has met or exceeded useful life benchmark by 10%, and to have no more than 20% of facilities rate below average. The safety performance measures are generated by our local transit. Demand response had a baseline and

target of 0 fatalities, rate of fatalities, injuries, rate of injuries, safety events, rate of safety events, and mean distance between major mechanical failure. Fixed route had a baseline and target of 0 for fatalities, rate of fatalities, safety events, rate of safety events, and mean distance between major mechanical failure. Injury baseline was 1 with a rate of 4.77 and the target is 0 for both. A motion was made by Mr. Toby Bennington to approve this amendment with **Resolution No. 824**, which was seconded by Mr. Mark Stephens. Motion carried.

Chairman Clendenning next called for discussion of Resolution No. 825. Ms. Messick explained this resolution is to adopt the FY22 Unified Planning Work Program or UPWP. This is a yearly budgeting plan for MPO planning funds. The draft plan was supplied as an additional handout and the budget breakdown for tasks and between municipalities were in the agenda packet. A motion was made by Mr. Jay Jenkins to approve this amendment with **Resolution No. 825**, which was seconded by Mr. Toby Bennington. Motion carried.

Chairman Clendenning next called for discussion CAC Appointments. Ms. Messick reported that there was a list of the members in the agenda packet to review. The City of Anniston still needs 8 appointments, 2 for the City of Jacksonville, 7 for the City of Oxford, and 1 for the City of Weaver. She further explained it was learned at the CAC meeting the day prior that Calhoun County and Hobson City will also have 1 vacancy which will be reflected on an updated sheet for next month's meetings.

Next, Chairman Clendenning continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that there was a handout in the agenda packet with the list of concerns from the CAC that had been discussed at previous meetings for review. There was one item that had been updated which was for the South Quintard/W Greenbriar signaling causing some traffic stacking as Mr. Toby Bennington had asked Mr. Lance Armbrester to look into traffic volume changes at this intersection.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Chairman Clendenning called for the status report on other local projects from ALDOT East Central Division. Mr. Shane Brown had sent a report for the current construction projects. This report detailed the AL-144 resurfacing and safety widening has been accepted for maintenance. US-431 access management has median crossover removal and turn lane construction in progress; milling is in progress from Saks up to CR-109 and paving should begin in the next month to month and a half. For Baltzell and Lenlock, all concrete and drainage structures are complete, the signal work is in progress, and they will resume work on the bike trail on the 20th of the month.

Chairman Clendenning called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick gave the report for the Fixed-Route ridership for the month of June, which was provided in the agenda packet for review. Ms. Messick explained the ADA Paratransit Ridership for Anniston had 592 (decrease) one-way trips, Jacksonville had 126 (increase) one-way trips, 29 trips for Weaver (decrease), and Oxford had 190 (increase) one-way trips. For the Urbanized area 183 (increase) one-way trips and 107 (decrease) one-way trips for the Rural area. Fixed-route ridership had a total of 7,197 (increase) riders for the month of June.

Chairman Clendenning next called for the Anniston Bike Ped Implementation Plan and Design Manual Update. Mr. Toby Bennington reported the final drafts were included amongst the handouts and JRWA will also do a final report/presentation in September for the MPO as these plans were funded with MPO planning funds.

Finally, Chairman Clendenning called for comments or issues from member jurisdictions or attendees. There were none.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Mr. Rodney McCain to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 10:25 am. The next meeting of the MPO will be Thursday, August 19, 2021 at 10:00 a.m.
