After roll call was taken and it was determined that a quorum was not present, Chairman, Councilman Jerry Parris called the meeting to order at 10:14 a.m.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

The minutes of the September 19, 2019 meeting were not approved and will be tabled until the November meeting.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Chairman Parris called for the Review of FY 16-19 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Lattisha Royal gave the members a copy of the current TIP and a list of the ALDOT modifications for September.

Next, Chairman Parris called for discussion of Resolution No. 792. Classification of Eulaton Gate Road. Ms. Royal explained this resolution was a correction from last month, the classification was listed as minor when it should have been major. Mr. Jay Jenkins advised that the classification was still incorrect in another portion of the resolution. Ms. Royal stated she would make a note on the Resolution for Ms. Messick to correct. This resolution will be tabled until corrected.

Chairman Parris next called for discussion CAC Appointments. Ms. Royal explained that there was a list of the members in the agenda packet to review. The City of Anniston still needs 6 appointments, 5 for the City of Oxford, 1 for the City of Weaver, 1 for the Anniston Army Depot, and 1 for the ALDOT Local Transportation Bureau.

Next, Chairman Parris continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Royal explained that in the agenda packet is a list of concerns from the Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC) for review. She explained that there was only 1 update, item #16 which is a timing issue at the light of 4<sup>th</sup> and Noble. She also asked if there were any further updates she could add. No updates were given.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS:**

Chairman Parris called for the status report on other local projects from ALDOT East Central Division. Mr. Shane Brown gave a report on the local sponsored projects which was provided as a handout for review.

Next, Chairman Parris called for discussion on the Rebuild Alabama Act (ARR) Annual Grant Program FY 2020. Information regarding the grant was provided in the packets. Ms. Royal explained that any municipal and county governments are eligible to apply. Project applications can be submitted for improvements to any road or bridge owned and maintained by the applicant and is open to public traffic. The maximum funding provided to any project is \$250,000. She further explained the grant is only eligible for construction activities. One grant per government agency is allowed and each county and municipality will be viewed as an individual sponsor. Applications for this grant are due by November 30<sup>th</sup>.

Chairman Parris called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Royal gave the report for the Fixed-Route ridership for the month of July, which was provided in the agenda packet for review. There were 7,868 passengers on the Fixed-Route which was an increase from the previous month and decrease from the previous year. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of September. There were 787 trips for the City of Anniston (decrease), 152 trips for the City of Jacksonville (decrease), 75 trips for the City of Weaver (increase), 118 trips for the City of Oxford (decrease), 116 trips for the Urbanized part of the County (decrease) and 223 trips for the Rural part of the County (increase).

Chairman Parris called for comments or issues from member jurisdictions or attendees. Mayor Johnny Smith expressed grievance with ALDOT billing process as the City of Jacksonville had received bills for about 4 different projects, one of which was a project that had been completed

about 10 years prior. He stated it was difficult for small cities to deal with these unexpected bills from so far back, especially when the invoice states the payment needs to be received in six months, but the bill is from 10 years prior. Mayor Smith explained that it was difficult for small cities who had just passed their budget for the fiscal year to receive these unexpected bills as there's no way to prepare for them. He further explained it may get to where small cities may not be able to do MPO projects because they wouldn't know when the final bills would be sent or how to plan for them. He said he would further discuss with Steven Corely, but there's got to be a better way to handle the overrun bills.

Mr. Fred Denney asked about the current overruns for the Snow Street project. Mr. Shane Brown stated that is the current estimate, it may be more or less, he was guessing at this time it may be less, but it is an estimate.

Next meeting of the MPO will be Thursday, November 21, 2019 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no further business, Chairman Parris adjourned the meeting at 10:27 a.m.





## Resolution # 794

### Amending the Fiscal Year 2020 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

WHEREAS, the **Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO)** is the organization designated by the Governor of the State of Alabama as being responsible, together with the State of Alabama, for implementing the applicable provisions of 23 USC 134 and 135 (amended by the FAST Act, Sections 1201 and 1202, December 2015); 42 USC 2000d-1, 7401; 23 CFR 450 and 500; 40 CFR 51 and 93; and,


WHEREAS, the US Department of Transportation (USDOT) requires all urbanized areas, as established by the US Bureau of the Census, to do area-wide urban transportation planning, and the designated planning organization to submit a Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) as a condition for meeting the provisions of Title 23 USC 134; and,

WHEREAS, consistent with the declaration of these provisions, the East Alabama Regional Planning and Development Commission, as staff to the MPO, in cooperation with the Bureau of Transportation Planning and Modal Programs, Alabama Department of Transportation, has prepared a Unified Planning Work Program for Fiscal Year 2020; and,


WHEREAS, pursuant to its duties, functions, and responsibilities, the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) proposes add additional PL funds awarded to the MPO and the City of Anniston for an update to the McClellan Traffic Plan in the amount of \$46,815 (\$37,452 federal, \$9,363 local match) into fiscal year 2020 in order to hire a consultant to update the McClellan Traffic Plan; now,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), that the fiscal year 2020 UPWP be amended as indicated above.

**6.1 McClellan Traffic Plan**

Objective

- Review and documentation of existing zoning, street acceptance, road maintenance, and official map actions taken to fold McClellan road network into the City of Anniston jurisdiction
- Review MDA Master Plan changes, recruitment efforts and strategies, and pending development plans or commitments.
- Review current population and employment estimates and forecasts from existing travel demand model.
- Identify and prioritize transportation improvements to address traffic impacts and resolve other network issues
- Define recommended transportation network and identify mission-critical facilities by functional class and maintenance responsibility
- Formulate guidance for road abandonment and realignment to accommodate proposed development and procedures for improvements.

Products

- An updated plan that will develop strategies, projects and policies to ensure the network will provide adequate levels of support for the development patterns.
- Provide guidance for both the year 2045 development horizon and full build out of the site.
