After roll call was taken and it was determined that a quorum was present, Chairman, Councilman Jerry Parris called the meeting to order at 10:07 a.m.

# **OLD BUSINESS:**

The minutes of the September 19, 2019 meeting were approved on a motion made by Mr. Fred Denney and seconded by Mr. Jay Jenkins since there was no quorum during the October 17, meeting. The minutes of the October 17, 2019 meeting were approved on a motion made by Mr. Jay Jenkins and seconded by Mr. Jeff Clendenning. Motion carried.

# **NEW BUSINESS:**

Chairman Parris called for the Review of FY 20-23 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Libby Messick gave the members a copy of the current TIP and a list of the ALDOT modifications for November and briefly reviewed it with them. Ms. Messick explained that there were two modifications that created changes on the TIP spreadsheet and 1 modification that did create any changes to the TIP spreadsheet. Mr. Jay Jenkins made Ms. Messick aware that one of the administrative modifications was not reflected correctly on the TIP spreadsheet. Ms. Messick will correct this item for next month's meeting. Mr. Fred Denney stated there was no RW showing on the Snow Street project. Ms. Messick stated it was not listed on the handout as it was a condensed version from 2016 to present and RW was authorized in 2015. She stated she would get it sent to him as well.

Next, Chairman Parris called for discussion of Resolution No. 792. Classification of Eulaton Gate Road. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was a correction from last month, the classification was listed as minor when it should have been major. A motion was made by Mr. Jay Jenkins to approve the classification request with **Resolution No. 792**, which was seconded by Mr. Mark Stephens. Motion carried.

Next, Chairman Parris called for discussion of Resolution No. 794. The resolution is to update the fiscal year 2020 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). This resolution would add additional PL funds awarded to the City of Anniston and the MPO for an update to the McClellan Traffic Plan in the amount of \$46,815. Ms. Messick provided the updated pages of the UPWP which exhibited a new task 6.1 as well as the breakdown of federal and local match for the City of Anniston only for the plan update. A motion was made by Mr. Jay Jenkins to approve this request with **Resolution No. 794**, which was seconded by Mr. Mark Stephens. Motion carried.

Chairman Parris next called for discussion CAC Appointments. Ms. Messick explained that there was a list of the members in the agenda packet to review. The City of Anniston still needs 6 appointments, 5 for the City of Oxford, 1 for the City of Weaver, and 1 for the ALDOT Local Transportation Bureau. Ms. Messick further reported that the CAC formally formed a membership subcommittee to not only help find people to sit on the committee, but to also review non-active members. Mr. Jay Jenkins also reported that he spoke with the Vice-chair that morning and they have about four or five potential members that they will be speaking to the mayor about getting appointed.

Next, Chairman Parris continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that in the agenda packet is a list of concerns from the Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC) for review. She reviewed the most recently updated items. Item #1 is still waiting on the power company. Item #6 was updated that Anniston has got the process started with Alabama Power. Item #8 is still stagnant and would need to discuss the issue more. Ms. Messick updated with item #11 with the traffic study is still ongoing. Item #16 the timing had been investigated and it is functioning as intended; this item is now in closed status. The newest item, #17, submitted by Mr. Theodore Smart was updated by the TAC that the issue had been investigated and there is a possible resolution presented to the Commissioner. She further reported the CAC also expressed special interest in item #12 widening US-78 east of the 431-bypass towards Sunny King Honda and the RV lot to three lanes.

Mr. Jay Jenkins requested a revision to item #13 to extend to Robertson Rd. This revision would encompass an incoming subdivision.

### OTHER BUSINESS:

Chairman Parris called for the status report on other local projects from ALDOT East Central Division. Mr. Shane Brown gave a report on the local sponsored projects which was provided as a handout for review.

Chairman Parris called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick gave the report for the Fixed-Route ridership for the month of October, which was provided in the agenda packet for review. There were 8,871 passengers on the Fixed-Route which was an increase from the previous month and decrease from the previous year. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of October. There were 903 trips for the City of Anniston (increase), 222 trips for the City of Jacksonville (increase), 59 trips for the City of Weaver (increase), 160 trips for the City of Oxford (increase), 82 trips for the Urbanized part of the County (decrease) and 226 trips for the Rural part of the County (increase).

Chairman Parris called for comments or issues from member jurisdictions or attendees. Ms. Messick reported that there would be a second ALDOT public meeting that afternoon from 4-6 pm at the Saks Community Center. There were no further comments or issues brought forth.

Next meeting of the MPO will be Thursday, December 19, 2019 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no further business, Chairman Parris adjourned the meeting at 10:25 a.m.
