After roll call was taken and it was determined that a quorum was present, Ms. Messick called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m. There were no new guests.

OLD BUSINESS:

The minutes of the May 21, 2020 meeting were approved on a motion made by Mr. Fred Denney and seconded by Mr. Brian Rosenbalm. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ms. Messick called for the Review of FY 20-23 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. She gave the members a copy of the current TIP and a list of the ALDOT modifications for June – July and briefly reviewed it with them. Ms. Messick explained that there were seven modifications that created changes on the TIP spreadsheet and four modifications that did not create any changes to the TIP spreadsheet in March and two in April.

Ms. Messick next called for discussion CAC Appointments. She explained that there was a list of the members in the agenda packet to review. The City of Anniston still needs 6 appointments, 1 for the City of Jacksonville, and 5 for the City of Oxford. Mr. Toby Bennington stated that there will more than likely not be any new appointments until after upcoming elections.

Next, Ms. Messick continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. She explained that there was a handout in the agenda packet with the list of concerns from the CAC that had been discussed at previous meetings for review. There were a few updates from the previous month. Item number 11 was awaiting response from FHWA and may be on next month's agenda. Item number 19 would move to the closed section next month as there's nothing further that can be done at this intersection and merging traffic is a common problem at comparable intersections. Item number 21 response from City of Anniston was the lights from 8th – 21st street are on a coordinated system so adjusting the timing on a turn signal would mean adjusting the entire system. It is now being looked into see the feasibility of extending the turn lane at this area.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Ms. Messick called for the status report on other local projects from ALDOT East Central Division. She gave a report included in the agenda packet. He detailed Snow Street was pending acceptance. Bridge painting projects were waiting on punch list items and on-going claims. Milling operations were to begin soon for Mountain street if not the previous week pending weather. Mr. Mark Stephens reported milling had begun, and pavement should start next week. AL 144 resurfacing and safety widening is now anticipated to start 1 August.

Ms. Messick called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. She gave the report for the Fixed-Route ridership for the month of June, which was provided in the agenda packet for review. There were 5,852 passengers on the Fixed-Route which was an increase from the previous month and decrease from the previous year due to COVID-19 restrictions. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of June. There were 764 trips for the City of Anniston (increase), 127 trips for the City of Jacksonville (same as last month), 79 trips for the City of Weaver (decrease), 180 trips for the City of Oxford (increase), 149 trips for the Urbanized part of the County (increase) and 129 trips for the Rural part of the County (decrease).

Finally, Ms. Messick called for comments or issues from member jurisdictions or attendees.

Next meeting of the MPO will be Thursday, August 20, 2020 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no further business, Ms. Messick adjourned the meeting at 10:22 a.m.

Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Adopting the Final Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for FY 2021 as prepared by the East Alabama Regional Planning and Development Commission (EARPDC)

WHEREAS, the **Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO)** is the organization designated by the Governor of the State of Alabama as being responsible, together with the State of Alabama, for implementing the applicable provisions of 23 USC 134 and 135 (amended by the FAST Act, Sections 1201 and 1202, December 2015); 42 USC 2000d-1, 7401; 23 CFR 450 and 500; 40 CFR 51 and 93; and,

WHEREAS, the US Department of Transportation (USDOT) requires all urbanized areas, as established by the US Bureau of the Census, to do area-wide urban transportation planning, and the designated planning organization to submit a Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) as a condition for meeting the provisions of Title 23 USC 134; and,

WHEREAS, consistent with the declaration of these provisions, the East Alabama Regional Planning and Development Commission, as staff to the MPO, in cooperation with the Bureau of Transportation Planning and Modal Programs, Alabama Department of Transportation, has prepared a Unified Planning Work Program for Fiscal Year 2020; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to its duties, functions, and responsibilities, the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Policy Committee, in session this the 20th day of August, 2020 did review and evaluate the aforementioned FY 21 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), summarized on the attached pages; now,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Policy Committee that the same does hereby adopt said FY 21 Unified Planning Work Program.
