After roll call was taken and it was determined that a quorum was present, Chairman, Councilman Jerry Parris called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m.

OLD BUSINESS:

The minutes of the June 21, 2018 meeting were approved on a motion made by Mr. Jay Jenkins and seconded by Mr. Fred Denney. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chairman Parris called for the Review of FY 16-19 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Dawn Landholm gave the members a copy of the current TIP and also a list of the ALDoT modifications for this month and briefly reviewed it with them.

Chairman Parris continued by calling for the discussion of CAC Appointments. Ms. Dawn Landholm explained that there was a list of the members in the agenda packet to review. The City of Anniston still needs 8 appointments, 4 for the City of Oxford, 1 Trucking Representative, 1 for the Anniston Army Depot, 1 for the Town of Hobson City, and 1 for the ALDoT Local Transportation Bureau.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Chairman Parris called for the status report on other local projects from ALDoT East Central Division. Mr. Shannon Jones gave a report on the local sponsored projects, which was provided as a handout for review, and Mr. Steven Corley gave an update on the ALDoT sponsored projects.

Ms. Landholm gave the report for the Fixed-Route ridership for the month of June. There were 9,905 passengers on the Fixed-Route during June. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of June. There were 963 trips for the City of Anniston, 274 trips for the City of Jacksonville, 21 trips for the City of Weaver, 164 trips for the City of Oxford, 317 trips for the Urbanized part of the County and 289 trips for the Rural part of the County.

Chairman Parris called for comments or issues from member jurisdictions or attendees and there were none at this time.

Next. Chairman Parris called for discussion of the Public Participation Plan Update. Ms. Landholm explained that Ms. Libby Messick had been talking with representatives from the ALDoT to get the requirements for the update.

WHEREAS, consistent with the declaration of these provisions, the East Alabama Regional Planning and Development Commission, as staff to the MPO, in cooperation with the Bureau of Transportation Planning and Modal Programs, Alabama Department of Transportation, has prepared a FINAL Unified Planning Work Program for Fiscal Year 2019; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to its duties, functions, and responsibilities, the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Policy Committee, in session this the 16 day of August, 2018 did review and evaluate the aforementioned FINAL FY 19 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), summarized on the attached pages; now,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Policy Committee that the same does hereby adopt said FINAL FY 19 Unified Planning Work Program.
