Next, Ms. Landholm called for Status Report of ALDoT projects. Mr. Steven Corley and Mr. Steve Haynes gave updates on the ALDoT sponsored projects. They both explained that there wasn't much activity going on locally at this time.

Ms. Landholm gave the members a handout of the Overview of President Trump's Infrastructure Proposal that was published on February 28th for review.

There being no other business to discuss, a motion was made by Mr. Brian Rosenbalm to adjourn at 10:47 a.m., which was seconded by Mr. Steve Haynes. Motion carried.



CERTIFICATION OF THE FY 18 TRANSIT PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT TARGETS

WHEREAS, federal regulations require that the Metropolitan Transportation Plans and Transportation Improvement Programs include Transit Performance Management Targets for urbanized areas and;

WHEREAS, the Technical Advisory Committee of the Calhoun Area MPO in coordination with the Federal Highway Administration, Federal Transit Administration, and the Alabama Department of Transportation has reviewed the requirement to adopt Transit Asset Management (TAM) Targets for use in the transportation process;

WHEREAS, the Technical Advisory Committee at its April 11, 2018 meeting recommended that Calhoun Area MPO support the Transit Performance Management Targets approved by the Alabama Department of Transportation as follows:

ALDOT Transit Asset Performance Measures—Tier II (5307/5311 agencies that are ALDOT's subrecipient of FTA funds)

- Asset Category: Rolling Stock (All revenue vehicles)
 - o Performance Measures
 - Age- % of revenue vehicles within a particular asset class that have met or exceed their Useful Life Benchmark
 - Performance Targets
 - Vans -- reduce by 10% of current active inventory
 - Cutaway Buses ---reduce by 10% of current active inventory
 - Body-in-Chassis-- reduce by 10% of current active inventory
 - Full size buses-- reduce by 10% of current active inventory
 - Statewide Goals will be to replace at least
 - o 26 vans
 - 3 small buses (16-21 Passengers)
 - o 4 small buses (24-27 Passengers)
- Asset Category: Equipment (Non-revenue vehicles)
 - o Performance Measures
 - Age-% of revenue vehicles within a particular asset class that have met or exceed their Useful Life Benchmark
 - Performance Targets
 - Overall reduction the current inventory by 10%
 - Equipment is defined as nonexpendable, tangible property, having a useful life of at least one year. (ALDOT will inventory only FTA purchased equipment over \$50,000)
- Asset Category: Facilities (ALDOT will only rate FTA funded facilities)
 - Performance Measures
 - Conditions- % of facilities with a condition rating below 3.0 on a FTA Transit Economic Requirement Modal (TERM) Scale

Performance Targets

No more than 20% of FTA funded Facilities to have a rating of below 3.0 (Good)
 Condition

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Calhoun Area MPO concurs with the recommendation of the Technical Advisory Committee and agrees to support the Transit Performance Management Targets as approved by the Alabama Department of Transportation.
