The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. by Ms. Libby Messick.

Upon reviewing the minutes of the August 8, 2018 meeting, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Mr. Mark Stephens and was seconded by Mr. Michael Hosch. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

There was no Old Business to discuss at this time.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ms. Messick called for review of the FY 16-19 TIP Spreadsheet. She gave the members handouts of the list of MPO projects and also reviewed the Administrative Modifications for the month. Ms. Messick explained that most of the modifications were done to match up the MPO's allocations on the spreadsheet with the spreadsheet that the ALDoT sends out each month.

Next, Ms. Messick called for Status Report of ALDoT projects. The local construction projects was given as a handout for review, and Mr. Steven Corley gave an update on the regional projects.

Ms. Messick continued by calling for discussion of Resolution No. 766, which is the Statewide Bridge and Pavement Performance Measurement (PM2) Targets approved by the ALDoT. A motion was made by Mr. Fred Denney to approve adoption of the PM2 Targets with **Resolution No. 766**, which was seconded by Mr. Brian Rosenbalm. Motion carried.

Next, Ms. Messick continued by discussing Resolution No. 767, which is the Statewide System Performance Measurement (PM#) Targets approved by the ALDoT. A motion was made by Mr.

Fred Denney to approve adoption of the PM3 Targets with **Resolution No. 767**, which was seconded by Mr. Brian Rosenbalm. Motion carried.

Ms. Messick continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Resolution No. 768, which will transfer \$11,822 from CN on project #3, to PE on the same project making the PE allocation \$34,822. A motion was made by Mr. Fred Denney to approve the transfer of funds with **Resolution No. 768**, which was seconded by Mr. Michael Hosch. Motion carried.

Next, Ms. Messick called for discussion of Resolution No. 769, which will amend the FY 2019 UPWP. Ms. Messick explained that the only change is transferring \$58,517 from FY 17, which were left over funds, into FY 19 to continue the update of the 2012 Calhoun Area Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan. A motion was made by Mr. Fred Denney to approve the amendment with **Resolution No. 769**, which was seconded by Mr. Brian Rosenbalm. Motion carried.

Ms. Messick continued by calling for discussion of the Update of Bicycle-Pedestrian Plan. She explained that there will be a stakeholder meeting on Wednesday, October 3, 2018 at 3:00 p.m. for who would like to attend.

Next, Ms. Messick called for the MPO/RPO Newsletter. She said that there is a handout in the agenda packet for review and said that the new newsletter will be sent out at the beginning of each month to the members.

Ms. Messick continued by giving the report for the Fixed-Route ridership for the month of August. There were 10,617 passengers on the Fixed-Route during August. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of August. There were 928 trips for the City of Anniston, 253 trips for the City of Jacksonville, 23 trips for the City of Weaver, 232 trips for the City of Oxford, 322 trips for the Urbanized part of the County and 319 trips for the Rural part of the County.

There being no other business to discuss, a motion was made by Mr. Brian Rosenbalm to adjourn at 10:40 a.m., which was seconded by Mr. Fred Denney. Motion carried.
