The meeting was called to order at 10:06 a.m. by Ms. Lattisha Royal.

Upon reviewing the minutes of the September 11, 2019 meeting, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Mr. Mark Stephens and was seconded by Mr. Fred Denney. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

There was no Old Business to discuss at this time.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ms. Royal called for review of the FY 16-19 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. She gave the members handouts of the list of MPO projects and reviewed the Administrative Modifications for the month. Ms. Royal explained that there were no modifications that created changes on the TIP spreadsheet and 3 modifications that did create any changes to the TIP spreadsheet.

Next, Ms. Royal called for discussion of Resolution No. 792. The resolution was a correction to Resolution No. 792 passed in September. The passed resolution called for Eulaton Gate Road to be reclassified to a minor collector but should have read major collector. A motion was made by Mr. Fred Denney to approve this request with **Resolution No. 792**, which was seconded by Mr. Mark Stephens. Motion carried.

Next, Ms. Royal called for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. No ALDOT representative was in attendance, but a handout of the projects was provided.

Ms. Royal then called for discussion on the Rebuild Alabama Act (ARR) Annual Grant Program FY 2020. Information regarding the grant was provided in the packets. Ms. Royal explained that any municipal and county governments are eligible to apply. Project applications can be submitted for improvements to any road or bridge owned and maintained by the applicant and is open to public traffic.

The maximum funding provided to any project is \$250,000. She further explained the grant is only eligible for construction activities. One grant per government agency is allowed and each county and municipality will be viewed as an individual sponsor. Applications for this grant are due by November 30th.

Next, Ms. Royal continued by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. She explained that there was a handout in the agenda packet with the list of concerns from the CAC that had been discussed at previous meetings for review. She further explained there was only one update from the last meeting which was item #16, a light timing issue at 4th and Noble.

Next, Ms. Royal called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. She gave the report for the Fixed-Route ridership for the month of September, which was provided in the agenda packet for review. There were 7,868 passengers on the Fixed-Route which was an increase from the previous month and decrease from the previous year. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of September. There were 787 trips for the City of Anniston (decrease), 152 trips for the City of Jacksonville (decrease), 75 trips for the City of Weaver (increase), 118 trips for the City of Oxford (decrease), 116 trips for the Urbanized part of the County (decrease) and 223 trips for the Rural part of the County (increase).

The next TAC meeting will be Wednesday, November 13, 2019 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no other business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 10:13 a.m.

Resolution # 794

Amending the Fiscal Year 2020 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

WHEREAS, the **Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO)** is the organization designated by the Governor of the State of Alabama as being responsible, together with the State of Alabama, for implementing the applicable provisions of 23 USC 134 and 135 (amended by the FAST Act, Sections 1201 and 1202, December 2015); 42 USC 2000d-1, 7401; 23 CFR 450 and 500; 40 CFR 51 and 93; and,

WHEREAS, the US Department of Transportation (USDOT) requires all urbanized areas, as established by the US Bureau of the Census, to do area-wide urban transportation planning, and the designated planning organization to submit a Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) as a condition for meeting the provisions of Title 23 USC 134; and,

WHEREAS, consistent with the declaration of these provisions, the East Alabama Regional Planning and Development Commission, as staff to the MPO, in cooperation with the Bureau of Transportation Planning and Modal Programs, Alabama Department of Transportation, has prepared a Unified Planning Work Program for Fiscal Year 2020; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to its duties, functions, and responsibilities, the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) proposes add additional PL funds awarded to the MPO and the City of Anniston for an update to the McClellan Traffic Plan in the amount of \$46,815 (\$37,452 federal, \$9,363 local match) into fiscal year 2020 in order to hire a consultant to update the McClellan Traffic Plan; now,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), that the fiscal year 2020 UPWP be amended as indicated above.

6.1 McClellan Traffic Plan

Objective

To have available additional PL funds in excess to the allocated yearly amount to assist member governments with the development and funding of special transportation or transit related technical studies.

Proposed Work

- Update the 2010 McClellan Traffic Plan to reflect changes in the development with and surrounding McClellan
- Update the 2010 McClellan Traffic Plan to reflect changes in land use and development strategies as well as priorities for the City of Anniston and the McClellan Development Authority
- Review and documentation of existing zoning, street acceptance, road maintenance, and official map actions taken to fold McClellan road network into the City of Anniston jurisdiction
- Review MDA Master Plan changes, recruitment efforts and strategies, and pending development plans or commitments.
- Review current population and employment estimates and forecasts from existing travel demand model.
- Identify and prioritize transportation improvements to address traffic impacts and resolve other network issues
- Define recommended transportation network and identify mission-critical facilities by functional class and maintenance responsibility
- Formulate guidance for road abandonment and realignment to accommodate proposed development and procedures for improvements.

Products

- An updated plan that will develop strategies, projects and policies to ensure the network will provide adequate levels of support for the development patterns.
- Provide guidance for both the year 2045 development horizon and full build out of the site.
