#### **MINUTES**

Technical Advisory Committee of the Metropolitan Planning Organization Wednesday, November 13, 2019 10:00 a.m.

The meeting was called to order at 10:05 a.m. by Ms. Libby Messick.

Upon reviewing the minutes of the October 9, 2019 meeting, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Mr. Fred Denney and was seconded by Mr. Mark Stephens. Motion carried.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

There was no Old Business to discuss at this time.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Ms. Messick called for review of the FY 20-23 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. She gave the members handouts of the list of MPO projects and reviewed the Administrative Modifications for the month. Ms. Messick explained that there were 2 modifications that created changes on the TIP spreadsheet and 1 modification that did create any changes to the TIP spreadsheet.

Next, Ms. Messick called for discussion of Resolution No. 794. The resolution is to update the fiscal year 2020 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). This resolution would add additional PL funds awarded to the City of Anniston and the MPO for an update to the McClellan Traffic Plan in the amount of \$46,815. Ms. Messick provided the updated pages of the UPWP which exhibited a new task 6.1 as well as the breakdown of federal and local match for the City of Anniston only for the plan update. A motion was made by Mr. Michael Hosh to approve this request with **Resolution No. 794**, which was seconded by Mr. Mark Stephens. Motion carried.

Next, Ms. Messick called for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. Mr. Shane Brown reviewed the local construction projects which was given as a handout for review. He explained the resurface and drainage improvements on Snow street is nearing completion. They are waiting on curing time for a permanent stripe and punch list items. The anticipated overruns had decreased from last month and are now estimated at \$188,819.38. Striping on 78 was the only item left for that project. Punch list items are the only thing remaining on the bridge painting projects. Mountain street in Jacksonville is awaiting a supplemental agreement approval from ALDOT.

Next, Ms. Messick continued by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. She explained that there was a handout in the agenda packet with the list of concerns from the CAC that had been discussed at previous meetings for review. Item #1 is still waiting on the power company. Item #6 was updated by Mr. Lance Armbrester who stated they have got the process started with Alabama Power. Mr. Denney stated item #8 is still stagnant and would need to discuss the issue more. Ms. Messick updated with item #11 with the traffic study is still ongoing. Mr. Lance Armbrester updated item #16 as the timing had been investigated and it is functioning as intended; this item could be closed. The newest item, #17, was updated by Mr. Rodney McCain that the issue had been looked into and there is a possible resolution presented to the Commissioner.

Next, Ms. Messick called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. She gave the report for the Fixed-Route ridership for the month of October, which was provided in the agenda packet for review. There were 8,871 passengers on the Fixed-Route which was an increase from the previous month and decrease from the previous year. The final table in the agenda is the ADA Paratransit ridership for the month of October. There were 903 trips for the City of Anniston (increase), 222 trips for the City of Jacksonville (increase), 59 trips for the City of Weaver (increase), 160 trips for the City of Oxford (increase), 82 trips for the Urbanized part of the County (decrease) and 226 trips for the Rural part of the County (increase).

Lastly, Ms. Messick called for a discussion on project overruns and financial constraint. She stated she has a running list of incoming overruns and with the bottom line for 2023 is \$113,792 and the Friendship Rd. project was not awarded ATRIP funds. She asked for each municipality to look at their projects to see if there are any adjustments that can be made either removing projects or moving them to long-range so that if there are overruns for current projects they could be covered instead of the municipalities accruing the brunt of the overrun. Discussion would resume next month after everyone had time to review.

The next TAC meeting will be Wednesday, December 11, 2019 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no other business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 10:20 a.m.
