#### **MINUTES**

Technical Advisory Committee of the Metropolitan Planning Organization Wednesday, December 8, 2021 10:00 a.m.

The meeting was called to order at 10:01 a.m. by Ms. Libby Messick.

Upon reviewing the minutes of the November 10, 2021, meeting, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Mr. Toby Bennington and was seconded by Mr. Rodney McCain. Motion carried.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

There were no old business items to discuss.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Ms. Messick called for review of the FY 20-23 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. She gave the members handouts of the list of MPO projects. Ms. Messick explained that there were two administrative modifications for the month that created changes on the TIP spreadsheet and three administrative modification that did not create changes to the TIP spreadsheet.

Ms. Messick next called for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. Mr. Shane Brown reported the US-431 access management project was working on the guardrail, bridge rail retrofit, concrete items, shoulder work, permanent stripe, and punch list items for the next week or two. Shoulder treatment for this project will begin in March. The SR-21/Baltzell and SR-21/Lenlock projects are awaiting final acceptance. The Church Ave project is finishing up permanent stripe and completing punch list items. The US-78 resurfacing project is placing permanent stripe and working on punch list items; it may be complete the following week. The I-20 resurfacing project is awaiting permanent stripe and punch list completion. AL-9 resurfacing has had wearing surface completed from double bridges to Natures Trail. This project has been winterized due to seasonal limitations and should restart in March/April.

Next, Ms. Messick continued by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. She explained that there was a handout in the agenda packet with the list of concerns from the CAC that had been discussed at previous meetings for review. Ms. Messick called attention to item #26 as the newest safety suggestion at 204/Nesbit Lake Rd intersection. Libby will provide Mr. Mark Stephens with crash data for this intersection.

Next, Ms. Messick called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick explained the ADA Paratransit Ridership for Anniston had 619 (increase) one-way trips, Jacksonville had 132 (increase) one-way trips, 14 trips for Weaver (decrease), and Oxford had 146 (decrease) one-way trips. For the Urbanized area 99 (decrease) one-way trips and 117 (increase) one-way trips for the Rural area. Fixed-route ridership had a total of 7,272 (decrease) riders for the month of November.

Ms. Messick then discussed a handout regarding the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and what it will bring to Alabama and possibly the MPO. Some concerns included funds specifically for reducing transportation-related emissions, vision zero assistance, and freight. Specific funding is unknown at this time, but the hope is if additional plans are needed then funding for said plans may be available.

Ms. Messick then discussed the Rebuild Alabama Act grant handout. Maximum funding provided for any FY 2022 project is \$250,000 and applications are due by January 14, 2022.

The next TAC meeting will be Wednesday, January 12, 2022, at 10:00 a.m.

There being no other business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 10:20 a.m.

WHEREAS, federal regulations require that the Metropolitan Transportation Plans and Transportation Improvement Programs include Safety Performance Management (PM1) Targets for urbanized areas and;

WHEREAS, the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) of the Calhoun Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) in coordination with the Federal Highway Administration and the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) has reviewed the requirement to adopt Safety Performance Management (PM1) Targets for use in the transportation process as required by 23 CFR 490.105;

WHEREAS, the TAC at its January 12, 2022 meeting recommended that Calhoun Area MPO adopt and support the Safety Performance Management (PM1) Targets approved by the ALDOT:

- Number of Fatalities Target: 961
- Rate of Fatalities per 100 million Miles Traveled Target: 1.400
- Number of Serious Injuries Target: 6000
- Rate of Serious Injuries per 100 million Miles Traveled Target: 9.00
- Number of Combined Non-Motorized Fatalities and Serious Injuries Target: 365

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Calhoun Area MPO Policy Committee hereby adopts and supports the Statewide Safety Performance Management (PM1) Targets as approved by the ALDOT.
