The meeting was called to order at 10:04 a.m. by Ms. Libby Messick.

Upon reviewing the minutes of the December 8, 2021, meeting, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Mr. Toby Bennington and was seconded by Mr. Mark Stephens. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

There were no old business items to discuss.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ms. Messick called for review of the FY 20-23 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. She gave the members handouts of the list of MPO projects. Ms. Messick explained that there was one administrative modification for the month that created changes on the TIP spreadsheet and no administrative modification that did not create changes to the TIP spreadsheet.

Ms. Messick called for discussion of Resolution No. 829. Ms. Messick explained this resolution is to add Project Number 100073971 Access Management on SR-21 from 0.71 Mile North of the SR-1 (US-431) Overpass in Anniston to George Douthit Drive in Jacksonville to the STIP/TIP. This project would not include any MPO funds but would need to be in the MPO's TIP as it is in the MPO area. A motion was made by Mr. Fred Denney to approve this amendment with **Resolution No. 829**, which was seconded by Mr. Toby Bennington. Motion carried.

Ms. Messick then called for discussion of Resolution No. 830. Ms. Messick explained this resolution is for annual updates to ALDOT's Safety Performance Measures. She further explained this resolution is to support these measures through the MPO's projects. A motion was made by Mr. Fred Denney to approve this amendment with **Resolution No. 830**, which was seconded by Mr. Mark Stephens. Motion carried.

Ms. Messick next called for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. Mr. Kyle Freeman reported the US-431 access management project was working on punch list items. The SR-21/Baltzell and SR-21/Lenlock projects are working on punch list items and awaiting final acceptance. The Church Ave project is finishing up permanent stripe and completing punch list items. The US-78 resurfacing project is placing permanent stripe and working on punch list items. The I-20 resurfacing project is awaiting permanent stripe and punch list completion. AL-9 resurfacing has had wearing surface completed from double bridges to Natures Trail. This project has been winterized due to seasonal limitations and should restart in March/April.

Next, Ms. Messick continued by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. She explained that there was a handout in the agenda packet with the list of concerns from the CAC that had been discussed at previous meetings for review. There were no new updates to Safety Observations.

Next, Ms. Messick called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick explained the ADA Paratransit Ridership for Anniston had 571 (decrease) one-way trips, Jacksonville had 125 (decrease) one-way trips, 16 trips for Weaver increase), and Oxford had 160 (increase) one-way trips. For the Urbanized area 89 (decrease) one-way trips and 125 (increase) one-way trips for the Rural area. Fixed-route ridership had a total of 7,745 (increase) riders for the month of December.

Ms. Messick then called for a discussion of planned FY22 projects. This discussion was to provide updates on where FY22 projects were with plans and/or potential upcoming lets in order to possibly move some projects out to future fiscal years. A handout of planned FY22 projects was included in the agenda packet. Mr. Toby Bennington reported the planned PE and CN phases of the Bicycle Lane striping and possible widening along South Noble Street from Chestnut to Fourth Street could be moved. Mr. Mark Stephens reported the Henry Rd. resurfacing project design is at about 70-80% complete and would also like to retain the George Douthit resurfacing project in FY22. Mr. Fred Denney reported the bridge replacement on Airport Rd could be moved and the US-78 and Barry St. intersection reconfiguration was in the May letting schedule. Mr. Matt Hawes reported plans for phase I of the Friendship Rd. projects was at 30%, RW could be maintained for all three phases, and UT could be moved out. Mr. Matt Hawes further reported the CN for the Russell Drive resurfacing project could be maintained.

The next TAC meeting will be Wednesday, February 9, 2022, at 10:00 a.m.

There being no other business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 10:30 a.m.
