The meeting was called to order by MPO Transportation Planner Jack Plunk.

Upon reviewing the minutes of the November 9, 2016, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Mr. Fred Denney and was seconded by Mr. Steve Haynes. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

The Anniston/Weaver/J'ville Road project is being closed out at this time and Mr. Plunk stated that there is no updated information available.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Plunk called for review of the FY 16-19 TIP Spreadsheet and MPO projects. Mr. Plunk gave the members a handout of the list of MPO projects to review. All projects highlighted in green have been authorized to move forward by the ALDoT. The projects in yellow are the projects that have been shifted from one FY to another with the additional 1% added to the allocation, projects highlighted in blue have had a recent up or down adjustment in allocation, and the projects highlighted in pink are ATRIP or ARRA funded. Mr. Plunk also discussed projects that have started construction or will be let in the next couple of months. According to his latest report from the ALDoT, Snow St. CN, Church Ave. PE, and RW for Noble St./4th St. Intersection Improvements will be let in January.

Next, Mr. Plunk continued by discussing Calhoun County's Request to Increase CN for Lenlock/Saks Rd. Intersection. There is a copy of the Supplemental Agreement for Utility Relocation cost increase of \$65,904.55 in the agenda packet for review. Mr. Plunk has indicated he had talked with ALDoT Metropolitan Planning and it was suggested to increase the CN allocation by the needed amount. East Central ALDoT representatives suggested that shifting money from CN to PE would be the best solution. After further discussion, it was decided that more funds would be needed so it was recommended that \$156,000 be shifted from CN to UT. The TAC recommended this to the MPO as a resolution for it's meeting on December 15th.

Mr. Plunk continued by discussing 2014 and 2015 Traffic Count Data which was provided as a handout for review. A quick glance indicates that total crashes, injuries, fatal crashes and fatalities have all increased for 2015 over 2014. Mr. Plunk contacted the University of Alabama regarding publication of the 2015 AL Crash Facts and they were waiting on ALDoT approval.

Next, Mr. Plunk continued by discussing 2014 and 2015 Crash Summary Data which was provided in the agenda packet for review. He said that the overall crash data increased in five out of seven categories from 2013 to 2014, and from 2014 to 2015, all seven categories increased. Mr. Plunk also discussed the Comparative County Statistics from 2013 to 2014 for Calhoun County. He said that although the number of crashes and persons injured went down for 2014, the number of people killed went up. The statistics were also broken down between urban areas of the county and rural areas.

Mr. Plunk continued by calling for Status Report on Local ALDoT Projects. Mr. Shannon Jones gave an update on the local construction projects which were provided in the agenda packet for review, and Mr. Steve Haynes gave a brief update on the state construction projects.

There was no other business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned.

The next TAC meeting will be Wednesday, January 11, 2017 at 10:00 a.m.


