After roll call was taken and it was determined that a quorum was present, Vice Chairman Jenkins called the meeting to order at 10:08 a.m.

OLD BUSINESS:

The minutes of the June 15, 2023, meeting was approved on a motion made by Mr. Mark Stephens and seconded by Mr. Toby Bennington. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chairman Jeff Clendenning called for the Review of FY 20-23 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Messick explained that there were four administrative modifications that created changes on the TIP spreadsheet and two administrative modification that did not create changes to the TIP spreadsheet.

Chairman Jeff Clendenning then called for discussion of Resolution No. 855. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was to decrease PE funds and increase CN funds for project 57 (100070203; 100070208): Resurfacing George Douthit Dr from SR-21 to Brierwood Place SW. A motion was made by Mr. Toby Bennington to approve this certification with **Resolution No. 855**, which was seconded by Mr. Mark Stephens. Motion carried.

Chairman Jeff Clendenning then called for discussion of Resolution No. 856. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was to adopt the Fiscal Year 2024 UPWP which is the yearly administrative budget for the MPO. Additional handouts of appendices d-f that included each task and task breakdowns were given to the committee. A motion was made by Mr. Toby Benington to approve this amendment with **Resolution No. 856**, which was seconded by Mr. Mark Stephens. Motion carried.

Chairman Jeff Clendenning then called for discussion of Resolution No. 8 Resolution No. 857. Ms. Messick explained this resolution was adopt the Final Fiscal Year 2024-2027 TIP. An additional handout which included all projects for these fiscal years, was given to the committee for review. A motion was made by Mr. Mark Stephens to approve this amendment with **Resolution No. 857**, which was seconded by Mr. Toby Bennington. Motion carried.

Chairman Jeff Clendenning next called for discussion CAC Appointments. Ms. Messick reported that there was a list of the members in the agenda packet to review. The City of Anniston needs 9 appointments, 8 for the City of Oxford, and 2 for Jacksonville.

Next, Chairman Jeff Clendenning continued with New Business by calling for discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that there was a handout in the agenda packet with the list of concerns from the CAC that had been discussed at previous meetings for review. There was only one item with any updates and that was item #33, suggested resurfacing on Moore Ave from the intersections of 10th and 15th Street in Anniston. Ms. Messick reported that she had contacted Councilwoman Ciara Smith for Ward 3 regarding the matter.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Chairman Jeff Clendenning next called for discussion of Status Report of Pre-Construction projects. Mr. Michael Bergh had reported at the TAC meeting the previous week project 41 was working on design variance and TS&L which would then move to plan in hand; 48 will have a plan review on the 29th and 30th; 49 is working on TS&L then environmental; project 50 is waiting on plan set; 57 can proceed to final back check and should move faster; and 33 will have plan review on the 11th and 12th. Mr. Michael Bergh also reported the SR-21 resurfacing will let in November and the SR-21 access management project will have plan in hand late September.

Chairman Jeff Clendenning next called for discussion of Status Report of ALDOT projects. Mr. Shane Brown reported Russell Drive resurfacing project is awaiting final acceptance; the reconfiguration of intersection at US 78 and Barry St including resurfacing, widening, and signals has utility conflicts; and US 431 resurfacing from just north of SR-144 to 0.28 miles south of SR-204 has begun permanent stripe and markers.

Chairman Jeff Clendenning called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick reported the ADA Paratransit Ridership for Anniston had 424 (decrease) one-way trips, Jacksonville had 155 (decrease) one-way trips, 14 trips for Weaver (increase), and Oxford had 68 (decrease) one-way trips. For the Urbanized area 76 (decrease) one-

way trips and 29 (decrease) one-way trips for the Rural area. Fixed-route ridership had a total of 6,648 (decrease) riders for the month of July.

Finally, Chairman Jeff Clendenning called for comments or issues from member jurisdictions or attendees. Mr. Toby Bennington reminded everyone of the economic impact supplemental plan report meeting the following week at the City of Anniston City Hall. Chairman Clendenning introduced Mary Roundtree from FEMA who spoke about FEMA's incoming National Flood Insurance Program audits.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:53 am. The next meeting of the MPO will be tentatively Thursday, September 21st at 10:00 a.m.





Purpose




Figure 1: Proposed Pedestrian Improvements – Option 1 (source: Alta)

The purpose of this assignment was to determine the feasibility of adding pedestrian features to the existing signalized intersection of AL-21/McClellan Boulevard and the US-431 southbound ramps. A pedestrian crossing is needed in the vicinity of this intersection in conjunction with the construction of the Chief Ladiga Trail project. The proposed pedestrian improvements are illustrated in Figure 1.

Traffic Data Collection




Figure 2: Existing Traffic Volumes

Turning movement counts were collected at the study intersection on Tuesday, June 6, 2023. These counts were collected for 4 hours between 7:00 – 9:00 AM and 4:00 – 6:00 PM. Figure 2 shows the existing traffic volumes during the AM and PM peak hour.

Pedestrian Crossing Evaluation

Part of this evaluation involved determining the appropriate traffic control for the channelized northbound right turn lane. The existing geometry of this channelized turn lane includes a large, sweeping radius. During our field observations, it was noted that most of the vehicles making this right turn maneuver were traveling at high rates of speed and accelerating as they moved through the turn. Several traffic control options for the pedestrian crossing of the right turn lane were considered (yield control, RRFB, HAWK signals, or signal-controlled), but there are concerns with each option due to the observed vehicle speeds. So, other improvement options were considered. If the channelized right turn is eliminated and that right turn lane is brought adjacent to the northbound through lanes, then that would eliminate the need for a separate pedestrian crossing over a high-speed approach.

Traffic Capacity Analysis

The existing traffic volumes were used to develop a Synchro model to perform capacity analysis. A site visit was performed, and the existing traffic signal timings were used in this model. The intersection is currently in "Free" operation.



A future capacity analysis model was then developed by adding pedestrian signal timing parameters to the signal operations. Two options were considered:

- This is the option shown in Figure 1. Pedestrians would cross the channelized northbound right turn lane, the US-431 entrance ramp, the US-431 exit ramp, and then AL-21/McClellan Boulevard on the northern side of the intersection. The pedestrian phase across AL-21/McClellan Boulevard would run concurrently with the westbound exit ramp phase.
- 2. This option would eliminate the channelized northbound right turn lane and allow pedestrians to make one crossing movement (across the southern side of the intersection). The pedestrian phase could either be run concurrently with Phase 1 or exclusively.

For both options, a one-stage pedestrian crossing of AL-21/McClellan Boulevard was assumed. A two-stage crossing is not recommended, as it would require pedestrians to stand in the median of AL-21/McClellan Boulevard until the next signal cycle. Also, a 10% growth was applied to the traffic volumes to provide a conservative estimate of future conditions.

The existing and future levels of services (LOS) are shown in Table 1. While both Option 1 and 2 would provide acceptable LOS, Option 2 would provide a safer route for Chief Ladiga trailusers.

Recommendations

Based on our analysis documented in this memorandum, Sain Associates makes the following improvement recommendation:

- The addition of pedestrian signal timings to the existing signalized intersection of AL-21/McClellan Boulevard and the US-431 southbound ramps will not significantly impact traffic operations at the intersection.
- The proposed concept should be modified as follows:
 - o Eliminate the channelized northbound right turn lane and stripe a new northbound right turn lane adjacent to the northbound through lanes.
 - o Eliminate the pedestrian crossings over the US-431 entrance ramp and exit ramp.
 - Relocate the pedestrian crossing of AL-21/McClellan Boulevard from the northern side of the intersection to the southern side of the intersection.
 - o These proposed improvements are illustrated in Figure 3.
- The pedestrian timing operations should include a one-stage crossing across AL-21/McClellan Boulevard.

Alabama Transportation Rehabilitation and Improvement Program-II (ATRIP II)

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is ATRIP-II? ATRIP-II is an ALDOT administered transportation infrastructure grant program for projects of local interest created in the Rebuild Alabama Act of 2019.

What projects are eligible? Transportation projects which improve any statemaintained highway system. Local roads and bridges are not eligible except for incidental work that is necessary in order to complete the improvements to the state route.

Who may apply? Any local governmental entity (county or municipality) within the State of Alabama.

How much funding can be requested? The maximum funding per project is subject to change for any fiscal year. Please refer to the current fiscal year's project application.

How many applications can I submit? Local project sponsors may only submit one application per year. Once a project is selected, a local project sponsor may not submit another application until the current project in under contract for construction.

How long is the funding available? Funds are available for 2 years from the notice of award. Funds awarded but not let to contract for construction within 2 years are subject to rescission.

Must a project be on a certain Functional Classification of roadway? No. Local roads and bridges may be included as long as the proposed improvements are an essential part of a project related to the state-maintained highway system.

Who is responsible for preliminary engineering? ALDOT will administer the preliminary engineering for all eligible phases of work as an eligible cost to the

project, unless the local project sponsor requests and is approved to perform the preliminary engineering at no cost to the project.

Who is responsible for obtaining any right-of-way or easements? ALDOT will be responsible for all work associated with obtaining any necessary right-of-way and/or easements as an eligible cost to the project, unless the local project sponsor requests and is approved to acquire the right-of-way/easements at no cost to the project.

Who is responsible for utility relocation costs? Local project sponsors are responsible for all work associated with relocating any utilities in conflict with the proposed improvements. Utility relocation will not be an eligible cost.

Who will let the project to contract? ALDOT will let, accept bids and award contracts for all ATRIP-II projects.

Who is responsible for construction engineering and inspection? ALDOT will be responsible for construction engineering, inspection and materials testing as an eligible cost to the project.

How does ATRIP-II affect other Federal/State Funded Programs? Projects identified to receive other sources of Federal and/or State funds may be supplemented with ATRIP-II funds (where allowed by ALDOT).

Who will select projects for funding? Applications will be accepted, reviewed, and analyzed by ALDOT. The eligible projects will then be presented to the Alabama Transportation Rehabilitation and Improvement Program – II (ATRIP-II) Committee as established in the Rebuild Alabama Act of 2019.

How do I apply? Local project sponsors may apply for ATRIP-II funding by submitting a complete and accurate project application. Detailed ATRIP-II procedural Guidelines and a Project Application can be found on the ATRIP-II webpage (www.dot.state.al.us/programs/ATRIPII.html).

When will applicants know they have a project selected for funding? All local project sponsors shall be notified in writing concerning the final status of their project application.
