After roll call was taken and it was determined that a quorum was present, Chairman Jenkins called the meeting to order at 10:08 a.m.

OLD BUSINESS:

The minutes of the November 16, 2023, meeting was approved on a motion made by Mr. Jeff Clendenning and seconded by Mr. Jay Jenkins. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chairman Jenkins called for the Review of FY 20-23 TIP Spreadsheet and Administrative Modifications. Ms. Messick explained that four administrative modifications created changes to the TIP spreadsheet and five administrative modifications did not create changes to the TIP spreadsheet.

Chairman Jenkins next called for a discussion of CAC Appointments. Ms. Messick reported that there was a list of the members in the agenda packet to review. The City of Anniston needs 9 appointments, 8 for the City of Oxford, and 2 for Jacksonville. Ms. Messick also reported that the CAC had voted to meet every month instead of every other month.

Next, Chairman Jenkins continued with New Business by calling for a discussion of Safety Observations. Ms. Messick explained that there was a handout in the agenda packet with the list of concerns from the CAC that had been discussed at previous meetings for review. There was only one update where Mr. Branton Cole reported an update for item number 6 in which the City of Anniston would submit a formal lighting evaluation request to ALDOT.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Chairman Jenkins next called for a discussion of the Status Report of Pre-Construction projects. Mr. Micheal Bergh reported Project 33 is mostly done and waiting on the environmental document evaluation and local transportation since this will be a local let; Project 41 will need detour route signatures; Project 48 needs materials addendum, PS&E review will be soon, and needs design waiver from the City; Project 57 will let this month; and Project 61 and 62 needs to contact local transportation. Mr. Bergh also reported SR 21 access management will let in March, SR 9 north of 78 will have 2 bridge replacements near Iron City, and there will be public involvement February 15 at 2 pm at the Public Safety complex regarding SR-204 from Nesbit to 21 as well as the TAP project on 21.

Chairman Jenkins next called for a discussion of the Status Report of ALDOT projects. Mr. Shane Brown sent an updated report that the reconfiguration of the intersection at US 78 and Barry St has utility conflicts, and US 431 resurfacing from just north of SR-144 to 0.28 miles south of SR-204 just finished RPMS and is waiting on sweeping and acceptance with punch list items.

Chairman Jenkins called for the Report on Urban Fixed Route and ADA Handicapped Transit Systems. Ms. Messick reported the ADA Paratransit Ridership for Anniston had 434 (increase) one-way trips, Jacksonville had 139 (decrease) one-way trips, 21 trips for Weaver (increase), and Oxford had 77 (decrease) one-way trips. For the Urbanized area 81 (increase) one-way trips and 32 (decrease) one-way trips for the Rural area. Fixed-route ridership had a total of 6,320 (decrease) riders for the month of December.

Finally, Vice Chairman Jenkins called for comments or issues from member jurisdictions or attendees. Mr. Aaron Dawson spoke to the committee regarding obligation authority. FHWA would like MPOs to spend as much if not all of their rollover funds by the end of this fiscal year if not the next.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:35 a.m. The next meeting of the MPO will be tentatively Thursday, February 15th at 10:00 a.m.
